

## WHAT CAN A HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY CERTIFICATE DO FOR ME?

- Increase your ability to get a job or be promoted.
- Allow you to enroll in college or a training program.
- Allow you to join the military.

### HOW DO I EARN MY HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY CERTIFICATE?

- Choose the testing option that is best for you GED™ or HiSET™.

  - Math

- Science

### WHAT DO I NEED TO SCORE ON THE TESTS?

- GED™: Earn a minimal passing score of 145 on all four sections of the test.
- HiSET™: Earn a minimal passing score of 8 on four of the five sections and at least a 2 on the written essay. Earn a total combined score of at least 45.

# DO I NEED TO ENROLL IN ADULT EDUCATION TO EARN MY HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY CERTIFICATE?

Although it is highly recommended, preparation and testing can be done on your own and at your own pace through the official GED™ and HiSET™ websites.

### HOW OLD DO I HAVE TO BE TO EARN MY HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY CERTIFICATE?

You must be at least 16 years of age or older and have been out of a regular school program for one calendar year.

 The calendar year waiting requirement may be waived under certain circumstances if it is in the best interest of the student.

### HOW DO I SCHEDULE TESTING OR LOCATE AN OFFICIAL TESTING SITE?

Testing schedules and locations vary across the state by test option. Testing can be scheduled online by creating an account. For information regarding how to create an account, please visit: ged.com or hiset.ets.org.

#### **HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?**

Testing costs vary by test option and delivery format.

- GED™: Computer-based testing fees are \$37.50 per test or \$150 for all four tests.
- HiSET™: Computer-based and paper-based testing fees vary from \$18.75 to \$23 per test or \$93.75 to \$115 for all five tests, plus a \$30 one-time administration fee.

### WHAT HAPPENS IF I LIE ABOUT COMPLETING MY HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY CERTIFICATE?

- Your employment may be terminated.
- An offer of employment may be rescinded.
- The federal government/a state may prosecute you and/or impose a fine.
- You may be determined ineligible for federal financial aid.

### HOW CAN I GET ANOTHER COPY OF MY CERTIFICATE OR TRANSCRIPT?
