

2210.01 Removal of Asbestos and Training of Abatement Workers

PURPOSE

To protect employees in state-owned or operated buildings, the general public, and workers performing asbestos abatement in such public buildings from improper exposure to asbestos. To provide for accreditation of abatement workers and contractors.

SUMMARY

The Asbestos Program assures that persons who may be working with products that could contain asbestos be trained in recognition techniques and, if warranted, also be trained in and authorized to remove, specific quantities to facilitate necessary repair/alterations. Individuals performing asbestos removal shall comply with rules governing such activity. The Asbestos Program also provides licensing for asbestos abatement contractors. These rules are designed to protect the employees performing asbestos abatement work and the general public that occupy the building in which this type of work takes place.

Asbestos regulations include Public Acts 3, 4, 5 and 6 of 1990; 440 of 1988; and 135 of 1986.
