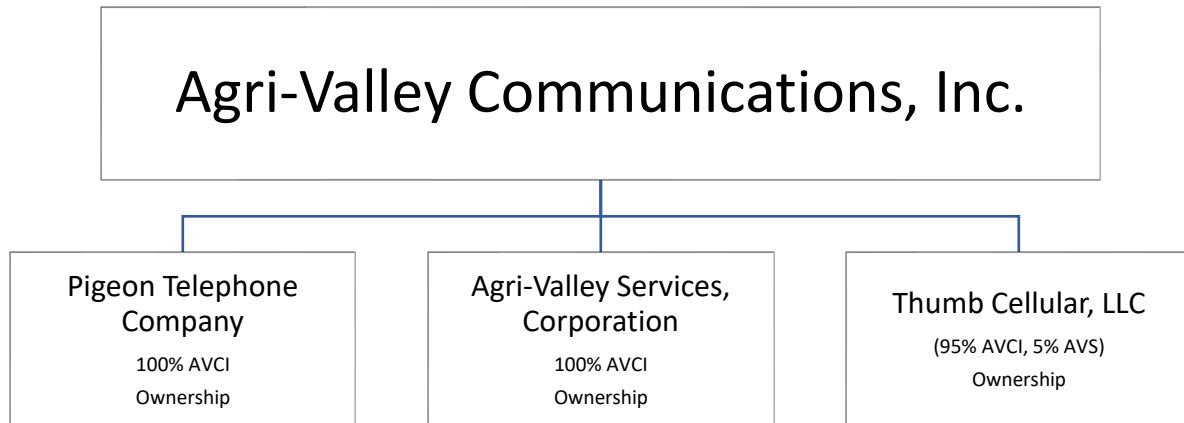

We the undersigned, certify that the proposed fixed wireless access (FWA) broadband system if implemented according to the design in the application will perform as described in this application. The reliability of the technology is comparable to networks of similar telecommunications carriers providing data services using fixed wireless access (FWA) technology. Per the manufacturer's documentation, when implemented according to the design in the application, the modeled coverage areas will be capable of supporting broadband services with data rates of 50 Mbps in the downstream and 3 Mbps in the upstream directions in the blue shaded areas within the attached RF predictions, data rates of 35 Mbps in the downstream and 3 Mbps in the upstream directions in the orange shaded areas within the attached RF predictions, and data rates of 25 Mbps in the downstream and 3 Mbps in the upstream directions in the green shaded areas within the attached RF predictions.

As the network needs to scale to support future demands, if the demand encroaches on the overall system capacity, the applicant will be required to review the proposed FWA network and utilize one or a combination of the following methodologies to increase the system capacity: utilizing sector splitting to better distribute the customer locations on the same site, adding additional channels to the proposed base stations and adding additional sectors and/or sites. In addition, as the total bandwidth usage at peak times approaches the purchased capacity for middle mile and Internet bandwidth services, the applicant will be required to increase the purchased middle mile and Internet capacities to mitigate the potential for network congestion.

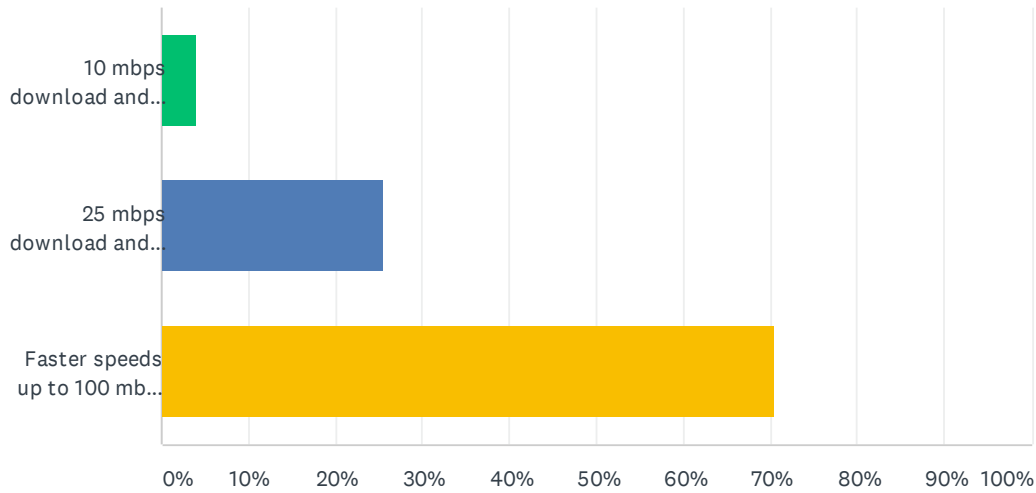

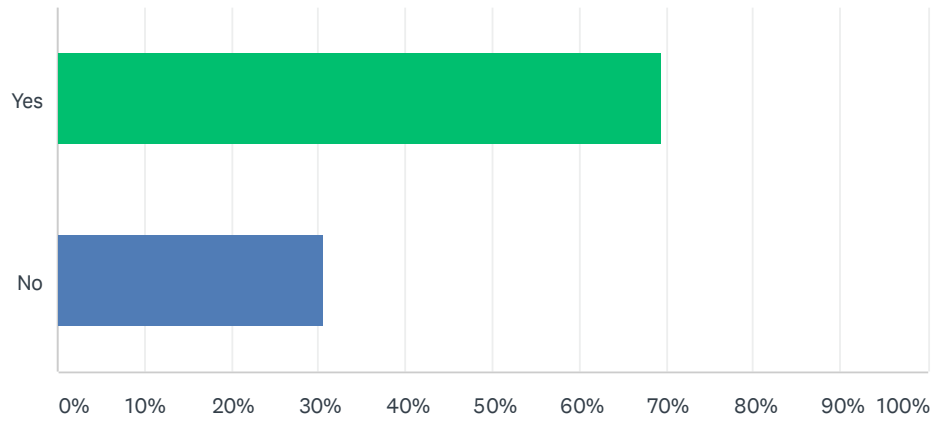

Q10 Is a \$99 one-time activation and installation charge fair?

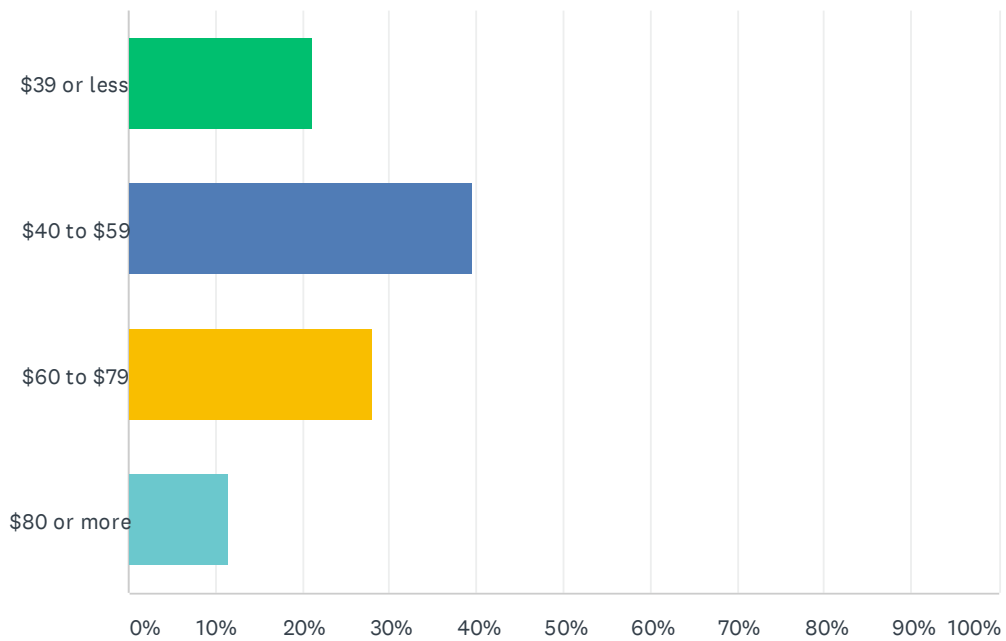





According to internet connectivity maps from the Kent ISD, the majority of rural Gladwin County is classified as “underserved” regarding internet access. For many years, the City of Beaverton and the surrounding townships have been challenged with access to adequate internet service. The recent pandemic situation in 2020 has only increased awareness of the underserved situation with students trying to learn virtually and businesses working from home. This grant application through the State of Michigan is an opportunity to improve services for these communities and future residents.

While it may seem like almost everyone has internet access, a shocking number of families lack fast or reliable internet connections. There are roughly 5 million households with school-age children who don’t have broadband internet access at home. That means millions of students are being left behind.

There are many ways that a lack of internet access can affect a student’s academic performance. Students without internet can’t connect with teachers or classmates, do independent research, or get online homework help. For families, not having internet access can mean missing out on information or losing out on a direct line of communication with schools and teachers.

One of the biggest problems faced by students without internet access at home is their inability to complete homework. Homework has long been a source of hot debate within the education community. Should homework be assigned? Those who say yes argue that homework allows students to continue learning at home and prepares them for the rigors of college. Others claim that homework is unfair—home is not an even playing field, and some students have access to more resources and a better environment for completing homework.

There are many proposed solutions. Some school districts now provide free Wi-Fi on school buses, allowing students to complete homework during their commute. Programs sponsored by the government and other organizations help provide low-income families with internet access. But nothing has yet completely eliminated the digital divide, and there are still millions of students who don’t have internet access.

Beaverton Schools is seeking effective ways to help the students and community members of Beaverton gain access to reliable high speed internet connectivity. The proposed project will help close the ‘digital divide’ that is being experienced in rural America. This grant will allow us to provide broadband access to our schools, businesses and community members. It is my understanding that the City of Beaverton in Gladwin County, is applying for a Connecting Michigan Communities 2.0 grant under the State of Michigan, Department of Technology, Management & Budget Office.

If awarded, this grant will allow the City of Beaverton and Beaverton Schools to fulfill a buildout in the Beaverton school district of a high speed internet solution at a reasonable price.

At the beginning of the COVID pandemic, Beaverton Schools were identified in a connectivity report, as one of the lowest in the State of Michigan for internet connectivity for its district students at 20% coverage. In October of 2020, the Beaverton School District and the City of Beaverton, in partnership with Mid Michigan College, worked with Connect Michigan on a broadband study that was completed on November 12, 2020. The results of that study were astounding, showing overstated broadband coverage in the area, with huge gaps in the school district being without coverage. The results of the study will allow the community to request a significant change to the broadband coverage map that is used to determine funding for possible buildout in a community.

The need for connectivity, especially during the pandemic, has never been greater. The additional stress on students, parents and businesses are at their peak. This low to moderate income community contains a K-12 school district covering 250 square miles. As indicated by the broadband report, internet coverage is overstated by the service providers in the area, which makes it challenging for Beaverton students to have the needed access to high speed internet for educational purposes. It simply doesn't exist and the changes need to be made now, which is why they are applying for this grant.

I am writing in full support of this grant application and the build out of the infrastructure that will supply the much needed internet coverage for the Beaverton community.


