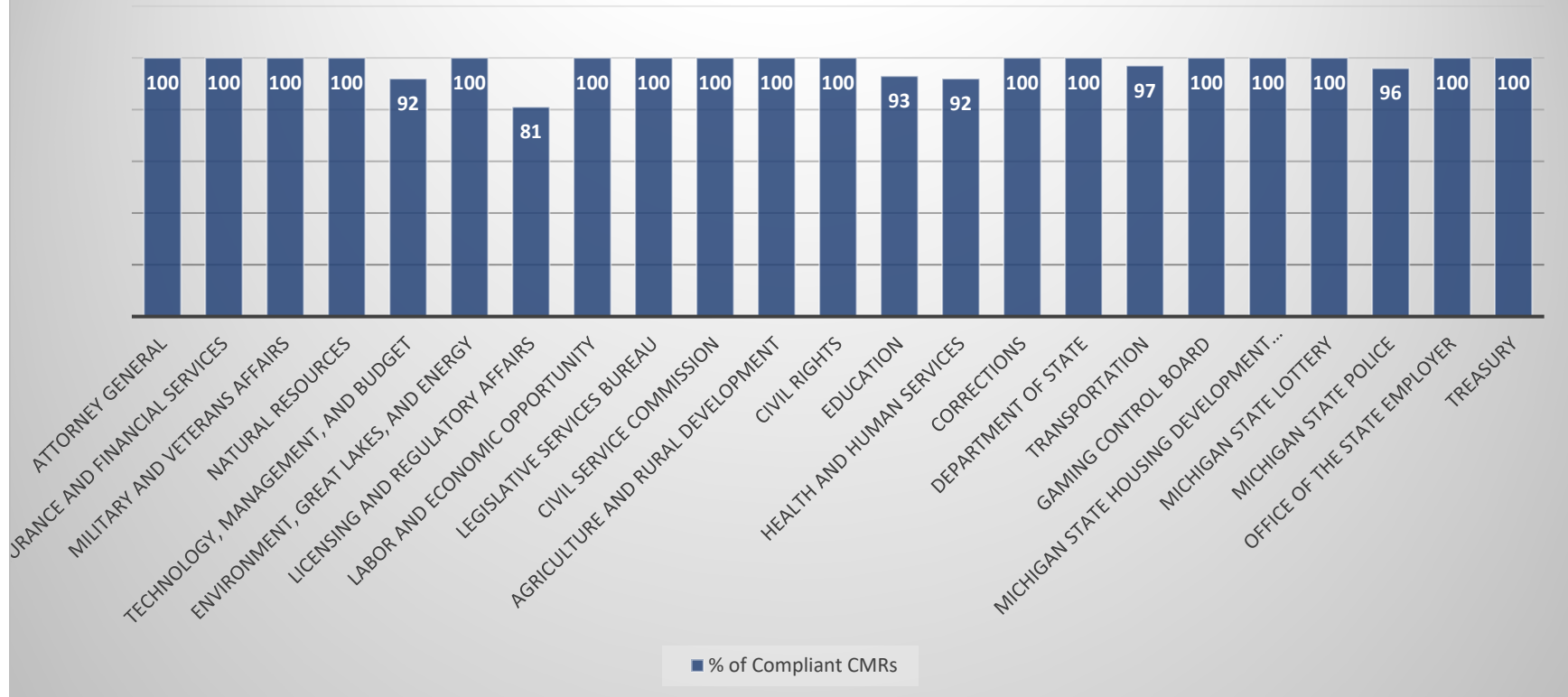

Pursuant to Section 822m. of Public Act 56 of 2019, the Department of Technology, Management, and Budget (“DTMB”) has an obligation to keep track suppliers’ performance in fulfilling contractual duties. DTMB has developed a tool that allows program managers (the individuals in agencies identified as responsible for monitoring performance) in every state agency to report standard performance information on their respective suppliers. These Contract Monitoring Reports (“CMR”) are submitted electronically to DTMB on a regular predetermined cadence and are automatically uploaded to a common database. The information is aggregated by supplier and used to create a Supplier Scorecard. Scorecards are accessible via an internal intranet site by all state procurement professionals and used as a factor in determining future awards.

All state agencies are currently using the CMRs to submit the required performance information. By DTMB policy, program managers are required to submit CMRs either annually, semi-annually, or quarterly depending on nature of the contract. More frequent reporting is required for contracts covering more critical or sensitive goods and services.

DTMB has set a target to have currently valid CMR’s from 80% of the 1,127 program managers. In determining which agencies are compliant, DTMB has used this as the benchmark. The following graph and chart provide information on each agencies’ compliance.

Agency Compliance With CMR Requirement



80% compliance in providing up-to-date performance information is the target requirement set by the Department of Technology Management and Budget, Central Procurement Services. Overall State compliance is 95%.
