RE: FY2019 Q1 Report of the Chief Compliance Officer.

The Chief Compliance Officer is required to report quarterly to the State Administrative Board and the Michigan Strategic Fund Board regarding compliance with internal policies and procedures and with applicable laws related to 21st century jobs fund programs. I am pleased to report that all compliance matters addressed during the first quarter of the 2019 fiscal year were either successfully resolved, are being appropriately addressed, or are undergoing review and are currently being evaluated.

With respect to the Michigan Strategic Fund Board, the Michigan Strategic Fund Act requires the Chief Compliance Officer to review and evaluate compliance with internal policies and procedures along with applicable state and federal law. The Chief Compliance Officer assisted the MSF with a conflict of interest analysis for a concerned Board member; questions regarding the counting the same job as both a Qualified New Job and a Certified New Job in separate programs; and Board Member Appointments. As reported previously, because of staffing changes the site visit guidelines were modified. Because of the staffing changes the site visit guidelines were changed by the MEDC compliance section to no longer require a minimum number of site visits. Site visits are being performed pursuant to the site visit guidelines. The Chief Compliance Officer provided informal advice regarding various issues arising this quarter concerning such topics as the breadth of delegated Board authority, authorized use of 21st century job fund funds, and compliance with established Board policy and limitations.

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CONTRACT PRE-APPROVAL

1. HIGHWAYS - Construction Engineering Services

Contract (2019-0200) between MDOT and HNTB Michigan, Inc., will provide for full construction engineering services to be performed for roadway rehabilitation and intermittent reconstruction, including drainage improvements, sidewalk upgrades, and possible non-motorized work, along M-60 from Chapel Road to Renfrew Boulevard in Jackson County (CS 38061 - JN 120277CON). The work items will include project inspection; staking; quality assurance testing and reporting; measurement, computation, and documentation of quantities; reporting and record-keeping; and finalization of project documentation. The contract will be in effect from the date of award through March 31, 2022. The contract amount will not exceed \$1,172,693. Source of Funds: 81.85% Federal Highway Administration Funds and 18.15% State Restricted Trunkline Funds.

2. *EXECUTIVE (Office of Economic Development) - SIB Loan

Contract (2019-0163) between MDOT and the Village of Spring Lake is a state infrastructure bank (SIB) loan to assist the Village in financing transportation infrastructure improvements through the North Bank Trail project, Phases 2A and 2C. The Village plans to use the Crockery Township Non-Motorized Trail Millage to repay the loan. MDOT will loan \$500,000 at 3.25 percent interest for 8 years to the Village of Spring Lake. The contract will be in effect from the date of award through December 31, 2026, Source of Funds: SIB Loan Funds - \$500,000.

3. *HIGHWAYS (Development Services) - Lease Extension

Amendatory Contract (2007-0433/A11) between MDOT and the United States General Services Administration will extend the lease by one year, with an option to extend the lease for one additional year, and will provide revenue of \$774,140.08 for the first year of the extension. The original contract provides for the lease of an administration building, a truck cargo inspection facility building, a canopy building, and inspection booths at the Blue Water Bridge Plaza in Port Huron, Michigan. The revised contract term will be November 1, 1996, through October 31, 2019. The revised contract amount will be approximately \$16,142,981.08. This is a revenue contract.

RE: FY2019 Q1 Report of the Chief Compliance Officer.

The Chief Compliance Officer is required to report quarterly to the State Administrative Board and the Michigan Strategic Fund Board regarding compliance with internal policies and procedures and with applicable laws related to 21st century jobs fund programs. I am pleased to report that all compliance matters addressed during the first quarter of the 2019 fiscal year were either successfully resolved, are being appropriately addressed, or are undergoing review and are currently being evaluated.

With respect to the Michigan Strategic Fund Board, the Michigan Strategic Fund Act requires the Chief Compliance Officer to review and evaluate compliance with internal policies and procedures along with applicable state and federal law. The Chief Compliance Officer assisted the MSF with a conflict of interest analysis for a concerned Board member; questions regarding the counting the same job as both a Qualified New Job and a Certified New Job in separate programs; and Board Member Appointments. As reported previously, because of staffing changes the site visit guidelines were modified. Because of the staffing changes the site visit guidelines were changed by the MEDC compliance section to no longer require a minimum number of site visits. Site visits are being performed pursuant to the site visit guidelines. The Chief Compliance Officer provided informal advice regarding various issues arising this quarter concerning such topics as the breadth of delegated Board authority, authorized use of 21st century job fund funds, and compliance with established Board policy and limitations.

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
