Description and Justification

The purpose of this modification is to expand the ongoing remedial investigation to address environmental contamination at the site. The site is a former plastics plating operation with known per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) contamination. The investigation has been conducted to evaluate the presence of PFAS in the soil of fields irrigated by two small ponds located down gradient of the site. The tasks defined for this work include installation of up to two monitoring well clusters in the residential and agricultural areas surrounding the site; collection of groundwater samples on a quarterly basis for analysis of PFAS, volatile organic compounds (VOCs), and metals; and reporting. The work is needed to protect public health, safety, welfare, and the environment.

ADDENDUM TO LEASE FOR PRIVATE PROPERTY

6. DEPARTMENT OF STATE, IONIA - Addendum No. 1 to Lease No. 11254 by and between JBJR, LLC, and subsequently assigned to, Fountain Plaza Investors, PLLC, and subsequently assigned to, Saginaw Ionia, LLC, c/o Pumford Construction, Inc. whose address is 3520 Davenport Ave, Saginaw, MI 48602, as Lessor, and the State of Michigan by the Department of Technology, Management & Budget for the Department of State, as Lessee, for 3,000 square feet of space located at 603 West Adams, Ionia, MI 48846. This Addendum provides for adding an additional 5-year renewal option at an increased rental rate. This Addendum is effective upon obtaining State Administrative Board approval and required signatures and continues to the termination date of July 31, 2027, or any extension. The annual per square foot rental rate for this space beginning August 1, 2022, is \$14.98 (\$3,745.00 per month). This rate does not include public utilities. This Lease contains a Standard cancellation clause with 90-days' notice. The Attorney General has approved this Addendum as to legal form.

Purpose/Business Case:

The purpose of this Addendum is to renew the lease for an additional five years at an increased rental rate.

Benefit:

There will be no need to consider relocating and/or spending money to relocate. Rental rate will increase yet is within current market rates for comparable space.

Purpose/Business Case:

The purpose of this resolution is to approve the form of the Construction and Completion Assurance Agreement between the State Building Authority, State of Michigan, and certain institutions, the conveyance of the Facility to the Authority, and the form of the Lease.

The State Building Authority is the State's primary capital outlay funding mechanism for projects that would otherwise be paid for by the General Fund.

Benefit:

The approval of this resolution will allow the State Building Authority to finance the Authority's share of the project with short-term commercial paper notes.

Funding Source/Commitment Level:

Short-term commercial paper notes will initially finance the Authority's share of the project through the acquisition/renovation phase of the project. At project completion, the short-term notes will be refinanced with long-term bonds, usually outstanding 15-17 years. The debt service on the bonds will be paid from the annual rental, appropriated annually from the General Fund. At this time, only a rental range has been determined. The annual rental will be within or below this range.
