Description and Justification

The purpose of this change order is to continue operation and maintenance of the existing groundwater treatment system for an additional 24 months. The system treats a chlorinated solvent plume to prevent migration of the plume to residential wells located downgradient. the tasks defined for this work include monthly discharge monitoring reports; 24 monthly site visits; 8 pump inspection and cleaning events; 6 carbon change out events; and other miscellaneous expenses necessary for operation and maintenance. It is anticipated that the cleanup activities will continue until the soil and groundwater meet cleanup standards. The work is needed to minimize the spread of contamination and to protect public health, safety, welfare, and the environment.

LEASE FOR PRIVATE PROPERTY

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, GRAYLING – New Lease No. 12163 with Grayling Center Investments, LLC, 27600 Northwestern Highway, Suite 200, Southfield, MI 48034, as Lessor, and the State of Michigan by the Department of Technology, Management & Budget for the Department of Health and Human Services, as Lessee, for 9,200 square feet of office space located at 2450 I-75 Business Loop, Grayling, MI 49738. The Lease is effective upon obtaining State Administrative Board approval and required signatures. The annual per square foot rental rate for this space beginning January 2, 2023, or upon substantial completion, is \$21.50 (\$16,483.33 per month). This is a fullservice Lease. This Lease contains two 5- year renewal options with an annual per square foot rental rate of \$25.50 (\$19,550.00 per month) for the first renewal option. This Lease has an annual per square foot rental rate of \$31.50 (\$24,150.00 per month) for the second renewal option. This Lease contains a Legislative cancellation clause with 90-days' notice for the first 10 years of the initial 20-year term. This Lease contains a Standard cancellation clause with 90days' notice starting at the 11th year of occupancy and for any exercised options. The Attorney General has approved this Lease as to legal form.

Purpose/Business Case:

The Department is seeking a new location prior to the end of their current lease. The new location will allow them to design a space that better meets the needs of their client base.

Benefit:

The new location will be designed to the Department's specifications, addressing their current business model and how they service their customers. The rental rate is within current market rates for comparable space.

Funding Source:

45% General Fund; 55% Federal Funds

Commitment Level:

Twenty-years; however, this Lease contains two 5-year renewal options and a Legislative cancellation clause with 90-days' notice for the first 10-years of the initial term and a Standard cancellation clause starting with the 11th year of occupancy and for any exercised renewal options.

Risk Assessment:

Non-approval of this Lease would force the Department to remain in a facility that does not meet their current business needs, and that poses a safety risk for both clients and staff.

ADDENDUM TO LEASE FOR PRIVATE PROPERTY

This Lease contains a Legislative Restrictive cancellation clause with 60-days' notice. The Attorney General has approved this Addendum as to legal form.

Purpose/Business Case:

The purpose of this Addendum is to add standard cancellation language effective March 1, 2022.

Benefit:

The Department is moving into new space and will need the ability to cancel their existing space before the current Lease end date.

Source of Funds:

40% General Fund; 60% Federal Funds

Commitment Level:

Through November 30, 2022, however this Lease contains a Legislative Restrictive Cancellation with 60-days' notice and upon approval of this Addendum, this Lease will contain a Standard cancellation with 60-days' notice.

Risk Assessment:

Non-approval of this Addendum will hinder the Department from leaving the space early causing them to continue to have to pay rent for space they are no longer utilizing.

GRANT OF EASEMENT

8. DEPARTMENT OF TECHNOLOGY, MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET (DTMB) FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AND VETERANS AFFAIRS (DMVA), CITY OF LANSING, INGHAM COUNTY: A recommendation and request that the State Administrative Board grant to the United States of America, for the use and benefit of its agency, The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), with offices at: FAA Real Estate Branch, FAA Central Service Area, 10101 Hillwood Parkway, Fort Worth, TX. 76177, a permanent non-exclusive easement for providing ingress and egress access to Grantee's existing doppler radar equipment by Grantee's personnel and motor vehicles. Said easement is described as follows:

A 20.00 feet wide easement for ingress and egress purposes being part of the Northeast 1/4 of Section 5, T4N, R2W, City of Lansing, Ingham County, Michigan, said easement being 10.00 feet on each side of the centerline of said easement described as: Commencing at the North 1/4 corner of said Section 5; thence South 89°59'49" East, along the North line of said Section 5, 632.45 feet; thence South 00°00'11" West 299.96 feet to the northeast corner of a parcel described in a survey by the State of Michigan titled "CSMS Site" dated February 19, 2002; thence, along the easterly and northerly boundary of said survey the following 5 calls: South 00°00'11" West 590.04 feet; thence South 89°59'49" East 120.00 feet; thence South 00°00'11" West 170.00 feet; thence South 47°25'08" East 65.73 feet; thence South 89°38'54" East 470.00 feet to the westerly right of way line of North Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. (also known as Dewitt Road) (66' wide); thence continuing South 89°38'54" East 33.00 feet to the centerline of said Boulevard; thence South 00°28'14" West, along said centerline, 68.63 feet to the point of beginning of the centerline of said 20.00 foot wide easement; thence North 88°50'53" West 490.80 feet; thence North 44°12'50" West 370.11 feet; thence North 00°07'05" East 280.38 feet; thence North 89°56'32" West 185.44 feet; thence North 00°29'09" East 57.87 feet to the point of ending of this easement description. This easement is subject to existing easements and other restrictions of record, if any.

The Office of the Attorney General has approved this easement agreement as to legal form.

Purpose:

To provide formal and updated ingress and egress rights to the FAA so it may continue to access and effectively service its existing Low-level Windshear Alert System (doppler radar equipment) which is surrounded by state land.

Benefit:

Granting of this easement will allow the State to ensure the FAA has the access it needs to properly service its doppler radar safety equipment serving the public and Lansing's Capitol City Airport at no cost to the State.

Funding Source:

The FAA has agreed to pay the State of Michigan a \$500.00 easement fee.

Commitment:

This easement will be a permanent, non-exclusive easement subject to existing easements and restrictions of record, if any. If the easement remains unused for a period of two years, it will revert to the Grantor.

Risk Assessment:

Failure to grant this easement will preclude the State from providing the USFAA with the ability to service the vital doppler radar equipment serving the Capital City Airport.







