DEPARTMENT OF TECHNOLOGY, MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET (DTMB), CITY OF LANSING, INGHAM COUNTY: A recommendation and request that the State Administrative Board (SAB) grants to the City of Lansing, through its Lansing Board of Water and Light (LBWL), whose address is 1201 South Washington Avenue, Lansing Michigan 48910, a permanent non-exclusive easement, for purposes of installing, maintaining, repairing and operating a buried public water main and related appurtenances (The Easement) to exclusively serve State of Michigan laboratory facilities under the jurisdiction of the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) located at 3350 North Martin Luther King Jr. Drive in the City of Lansing, Ingham County, Michigan. #### Purpose:

An easement on State property allowing The City of Lansing to install, maintain, repair and operate buried potable water mains and related appurtenances to serve State of Michigan laboratory facilities under the jurisdiction of the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) and located at 3350 North Martin Luther King Jr. Drive in the City of Lansing, Ingham County, Michigan.

#### **Benefit:**

Granting this easement will permanently memorialize mutually acceptable terms for the Lansing Board of Water and Light to provide potable water to the State's laboratory facilities using existing water main infrastructures on State property as described herein, thus minimizing chances for misunderstandings about what those terms include in the future.

#### Commitment:

This easement will be a permanent, non-exclusive easement subject to existing easements and restrictions of record, if any. If the easement remains unused for a period of two years, it will revert to the State of Michigan as Grantor.

#### **Risk Assessment:**

Failure to grant this easement will preclude the parties from memorializing mutually acceptable terms for the provision of potable water to the State's laboratory facilities by

the Lansing Board of Water and Light. In turn, that could lead to misunderstandings in the future about what those terms include.
