This Addendum is to memorialize a Change of Ownership, modify paragraph timeframe for carpet, paint and ceiling tiles, add one five-year renewal option, modify janitorial responsibility upon exercising renewal options 2.6 and 2.7, reduce rental rate for renewal option 2.6 to reflect the janitorial responsibility change and other Lease language updates. This Addendum is effective upon obtaining State Administrative Board approval and required signatures and continues to the termination date of January 31, 2029, or any extension. The annual per square foot rental rate for this space beginning February 1, 2024, is \$17.05 (\$17,866.98 per month). This Addendum contains two five-year renewal options with an annual per square foot rental rate of \$17.01 (\$17,825.06 per month) and \$18.76 (\$19,658.92 per month), respectively. The current rental rate does not include public utilities. The rental rates for the two five-year renewal options do not include public utilities or janitorial services and supplies. This Lease contains a standard cancellation clause with 90 days' notice. The Attorney General has approved this Addendum as to legal form.

# Purpose/Business Case:

The purpose of this resolution is to approve the form of the Construction and Completion Assurance Agreement between the State Building Authority, State of Michigan, and certain facilities, the conveyance of the Facility to the Authority, and the form of the Lease.

The State Building Authority is the State's primary capital outlay funding mechanism for projects that would otherwise be paid for by the General Fund.

# Benefit:

The approval of this resolution will allow the State Building Authority to finance the Authority's share of the project with short-term commercial paper notes.

# Funding Source/Commitment Level:

Short-term commercial paper notes will initially finance the Authority's share of the project through the acquisition/renovation phase of the project. 26. DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES – That the following property be transferred, under authority of Act 258 of the Public Acts of 2003 (MCL124.770 Section 20): (1) The state administrative board may transfer to the state authority tax reverted property owned or under control of this state, on terms and conditions the state administrative board considers appropriate and consistent with the provisions of this act. A transfer of property by the state administrative board under this section is subject only to the terms and conditions imposed by the state administrative board and is not subject to section 2101 of the natural resources and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.2101.

#### Background:

Tax reverted land not needed by the DNR may be transferred to the Land Bank. The transferred land is in Arenac, Baraga, Benzie, Branch, Calhoun, Charlevoix, Cheboygan, Chippewa, Crawford, Dickinson, Emmet, Gogebic, Grand Traverse, Houghton, Huron, Ingham, Iosco, Iron, Kalamazoo, Lake, Mackinac, Macomb, Manistee, Mecosta, Menominee, Midland, Missaukee, Monroe, Montmorency, Muskegon, Newaygo, Oakland, Ogemaw, Ontonagon, Oscoda, Presque Isle, Roscommon, Saint Clair, Tuscola, Van Buren, Washtenaw, Wayne, and Wexford Counties, and is surplus to the DNR needs. These parcels have documented title issues, and the descriptions are on file with the SAB.

## Purpose/Business Case:

This is a request to authorize the transfer of Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) managed property to the Michigan State Land Bank Authority (MSLBA). During

the MDNR Statewide Land Review that was conducted between 2021 and 2024, over a thousand parcels were approved for disposal. After preliminary research, it was evident that several of these surplus parcels had clouded title or ownership issues. It is expensive to obtain/review title documents and labor intensive for DNR to attempt to resolve these issues. The properties that were identified as being acquired via tax reversion have been packaged together for a transfer to the MSLBA. Following the transfer of this property, the MSLBA will record the county affidavits and exhibits in each respective county register of deeds office.

**Benefit:** MDNR will no longer have a management interest in properties with clouded title and or contested ownership. MSLBA has more resources to clear the title and/or resolve the documented issues on behalf of the State of Michigan.
