Honoring those who stood before us: Flag Placement on May 22nd at MVH at Grand Rapids

Did you know that the cemetery on the campus of MVH at Grand Rapids has been interring veterans <u>since the late 1800s</u>? MVH veterans from the Civil War through present day have chosen to make these hallowed grounds their final resting place, and continue to do so. Each May prior to Memorial Day, Scouts of America, friends of MVH, and the community join together to place 5,400+ flags at each headstone as a symbol of appreciation for the service and sacrifice of those who stood before us.

That tradition continues. On May 22nd at 5pm, there will be a hot dog cookout sponsored by the UPS Veteran Business Resource Group, followed by a 6pm procession of the colors, a brief ceremony, and the placement of more than 5,400 flags at each final resting place.

Community members are invited to join the Scouts, MVH, and UPS Veteran Business Resource Group for this special tribute, as well. The event honors the lives and legacies of those veterans who stood before us, while connecting youth and community to the importance of service and sacrifice. Lest we forget.

MVH welcomes Shawn Turner to its governing board of directors

On April 11, 2024, Governor Gretchen Whitmer appointed Marine Corps veteran Shawn Turner to serve on the Michigan Veterans' Facility Authority Board of Directors.

Shawn Turner is the General Manager of WKAR Public Media and a Professor of Strategic Communication at Michigan State University. He previously served in several federal government positions including Deputy White House Press Secretary for National Security, Director of Communication for U.S. National Intelligence, and Deputy Press Secretary for Foreign Affairs for the National Security Council.

He is currently a member of the board of directors for National Public Radio (NPR), the board of trustees for the German Marshall fund (GMF), and the executive board of advisors for Center for Ethics and the Rule of Law (CERL) at the University of Pennsylvania.

In 2015, Shawn was awarded the Intelligence Community Leadership Award, and in 2016, he was awarded the Meritorious Presidential Rank Award for outstanding career accomplishments and exemplary service to the nation.

Prior to his civilian career, Shawn served 21 years in the United States Marine Corps. He received his B.A. degree in communication studies from Texas State University and an M.A. degree in communication from George Mason University. He was selected by the majority leader of the senate and appointed by Gov. Whitmer, with the advice and consent of the senate.

The MVFA is still seeking to fill an additional seat on its board, to be appointed by the Governor from a list of two or more individuals selected by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
