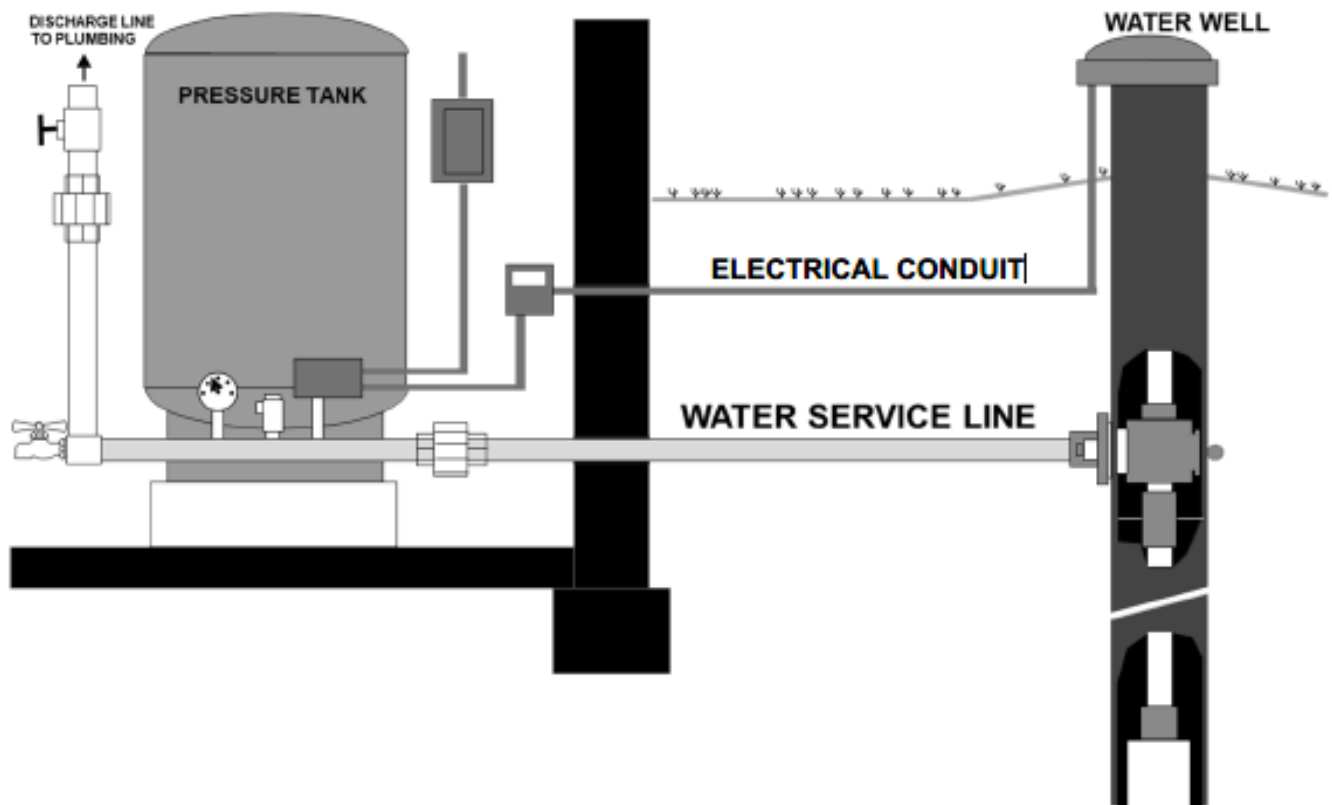
*The Michigan Safe Drinking Water Act, 1976 PA 399, as amended, requires that water supplies develop and maintain a CDSMI. Pursuant to Rule 325.11604(c)(ii), the CDSMI must be submitted to the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE). Federal rule 40 CFR § Part 141.84(a) also requires submission of an inventory by October 16, 2024. To meet both state and federal requirements, **the CDSMI must be submitted to EGLE by October 16, 2024.***

Complete this form if the water supply does NOT have service lines meeting the following definition.

“Service line” means the pipe from the discharge of the corporation fitting to customer site piping or to the building plumbing at the first shut-off valve inside the building, or 18 inches inside the building, whichever is shorter.

This form is specific to water supplies with distribution systems limited in extent, which may include apartments, nursing homes, and other similar buildings. The figure below provides the typical water well system for supplies with a distribution system limited in extent.

CDSMI FOR WATER SUPPLIES WITH DISTRIBUTION SYSTEMS LIMITED IN EXTENT INSTRUCTIONS

This page is provided as a guide to assist with questions that may be asked when completing the summary form. Because water supplies differ significantly in terms of service line materials and records, many questions require a narrative response to allow flexibility. Please provide thorough answers that provide meaningful information about the status of your water supply's service line inventory.

PWSID¹: The Public Water System Identification (PWSID) is a combination of MI00 plus the water supply's 5-digit WSSN (e.g., if the WSSN is 01234, the PWSID is MI0001234).

Part I: Detailed Inventory

- **Physical Address or Unique Identifier:** Provide a physical address for each service line. If there are multiple service lines for one address, create a unique identifier for each service line (e.g., General location, Building ID, Service Line ID).
- **Service Line Materials:** List all materials present in the service line, multiple materials may be listed together (Copper/Plastic), examples are given below.
 - Lead
 - Copper
 - Galvanized
 - Plastic
 - Other (specify)
 - Unknown
- **Verification Methodology:** Service line materials may be identified through existing records or physical verification. Methods of identification may include:
 - Era of Construction (post 1989)
 - Existing Records (e.g., As-builts, Construction plans/specifications, Permits, General Plan, Asset Management Plan)
 - Ordinances or controls (local ordinance/law banning lead service lines after a certain date)
 - Physical verification
 - Other (Specify)
