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What is the MI Clean Water Plan?

Grants to communities to address water infrastructure needs

\$500 million investment

Two Components

- Drinking water
- Wastewater

Legislative action needed for wastewater component



Types of Water Infrastructure Projects



Wastewater Programs

\$290 million - Grants for wastewater infrastructure projects

- Funding falls into three categories:
 - Addressing sewer overflows and increasing green infrastructure - \$235 million
 - Removing sewage discharge to surface water and ground water - \$20 million
 - Elimination of failing septic systems - \$35 million



Wastewater Legislative Ask

Support for \$290 million appropriation in 2022 budget

Support for legislative amendment

- Move remaining voter approved Great Lakes Protection Bond of 2002 to the Strategic Water Quality Initiative Fund
- Process consistent with programs previously funded by the bond

Drinking Water Next Steps

\$70 million in grants to be announced in April

- Consolidation and Contamination Risk Reduction Grants - \$25 Million
- Drinking Water Asset Management Grants - \$36.5 million
- Affordability and Planning Grants - \$7.5 million
- Water Advisory Councils - \$1 million

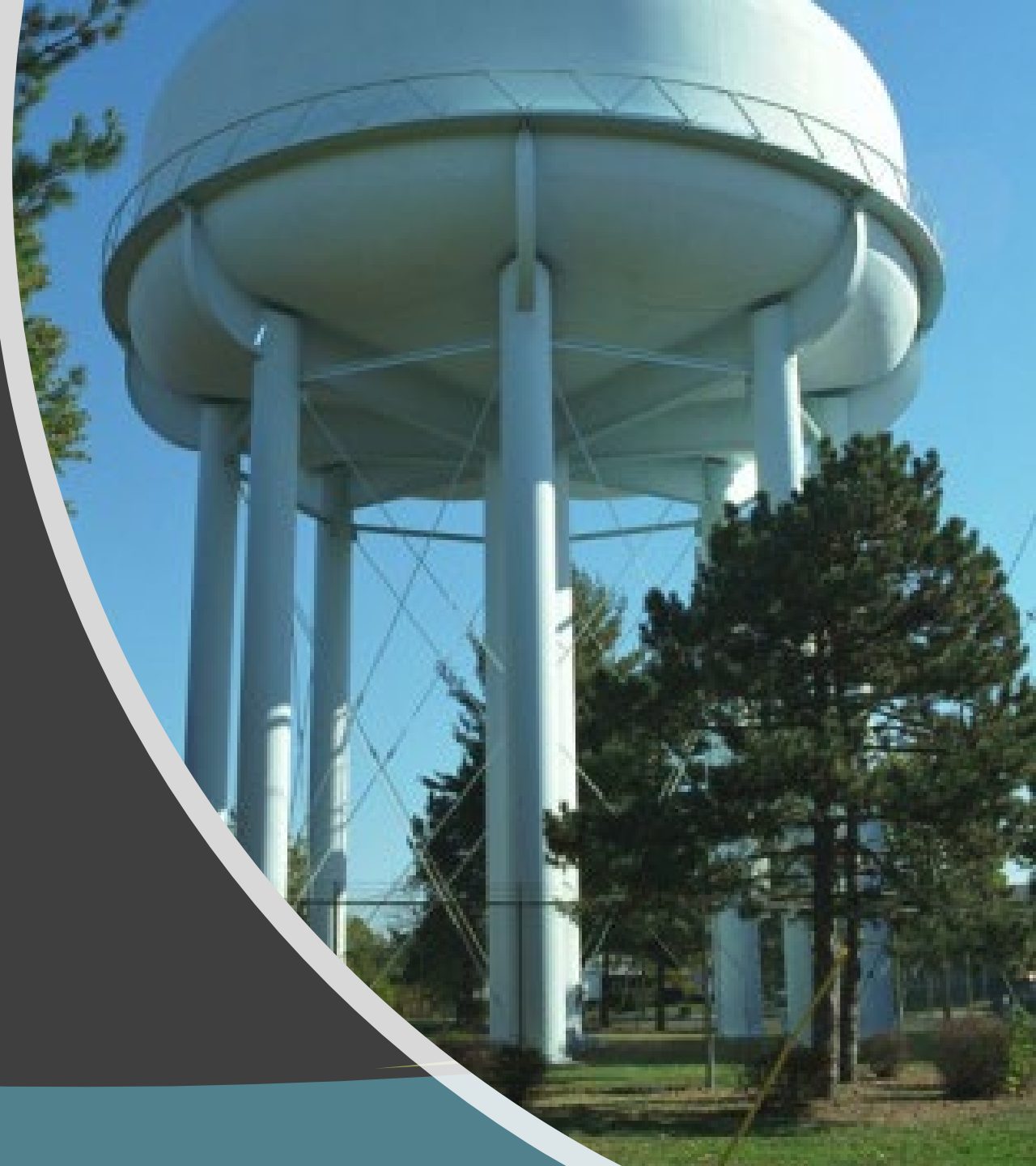
\$137 million in financing to be announced in late summer

- Disadvantaged Community Lead Service Line Replacement Program - \$102 million
- Drinking Water Infrastructure Grants - \$35 million

State Revolving Fund (SRF) Overview

Provides low-interest loan financing to qualified municipalities to assist with the construction or improvement of public water systems or water pollution control facilities.

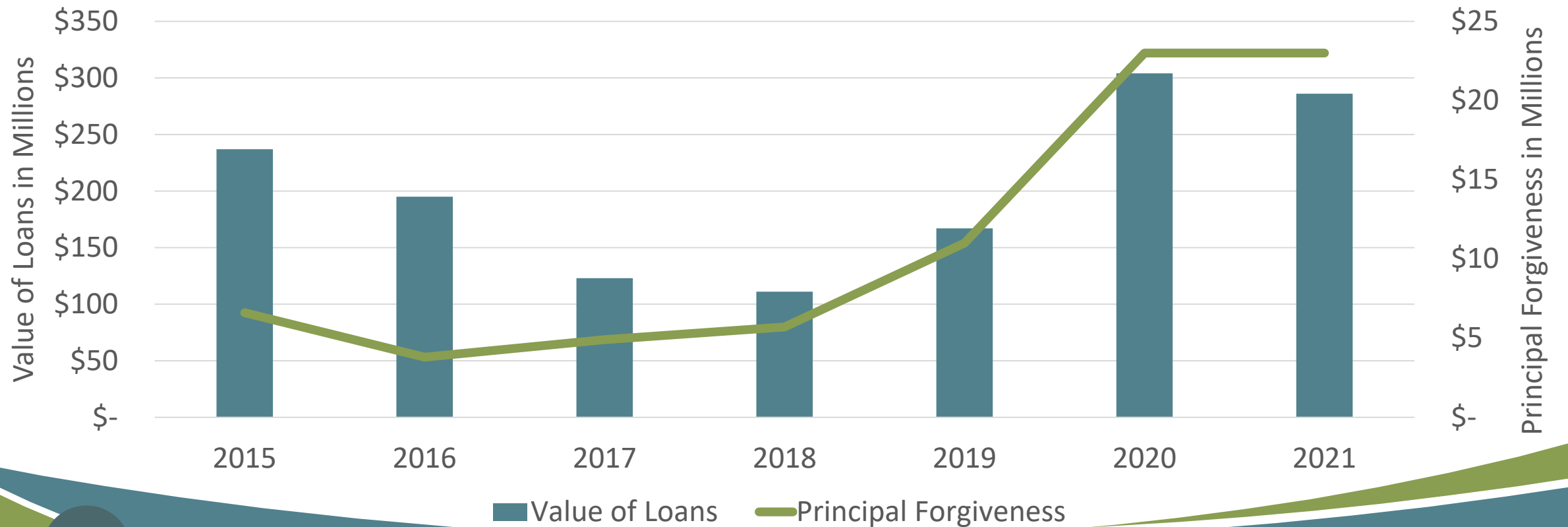
- Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) FY2022
 - Fundable range \$250.0 million
 - 130 requested projects totaling \$720.8 million
- Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) FY2022
 - Fundable range \$800 million
 - 97 requested projects totaling \$757 million



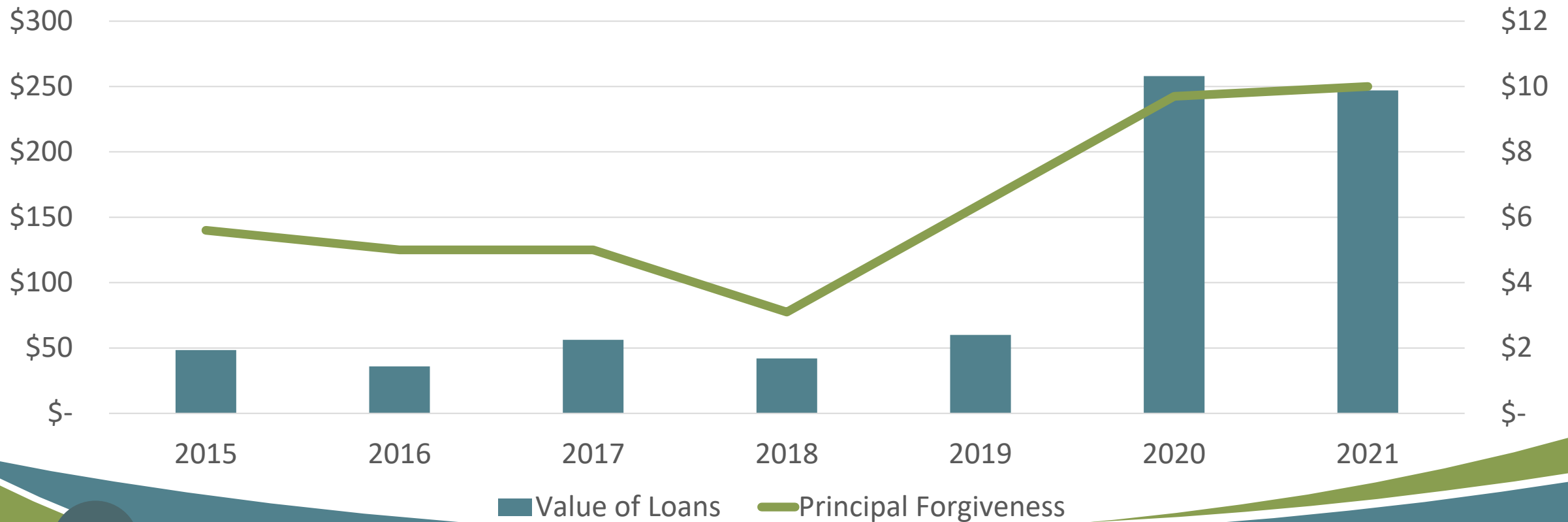
Important State Revolving Fund Dates

- By June 1, 2021 - Project Plans for CWSRF due
 - July 2021 - Draft Intended Use Plans containing Project Priority List
- By July 1, 2021 - Project Plans for DWSRF due
 - August 2021 - Draft Intended Use Plans containing Project Priority List
- On or before September 15, 2021 - Target date for Final Intended Use Plans
