The AAC Charter says:

- Address issues of mutual interest.

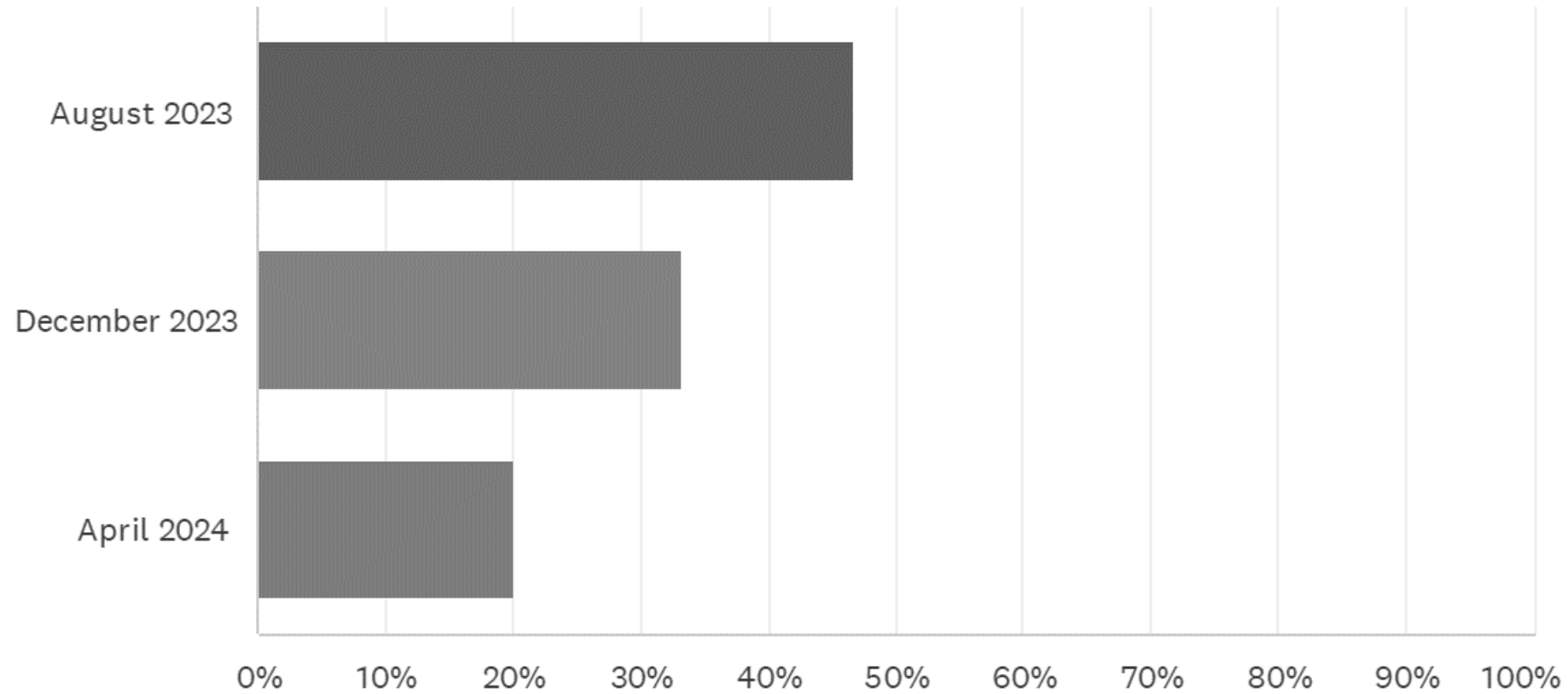
# Goal of the survey:

- There are 22 members of the council outside of AQD staff.

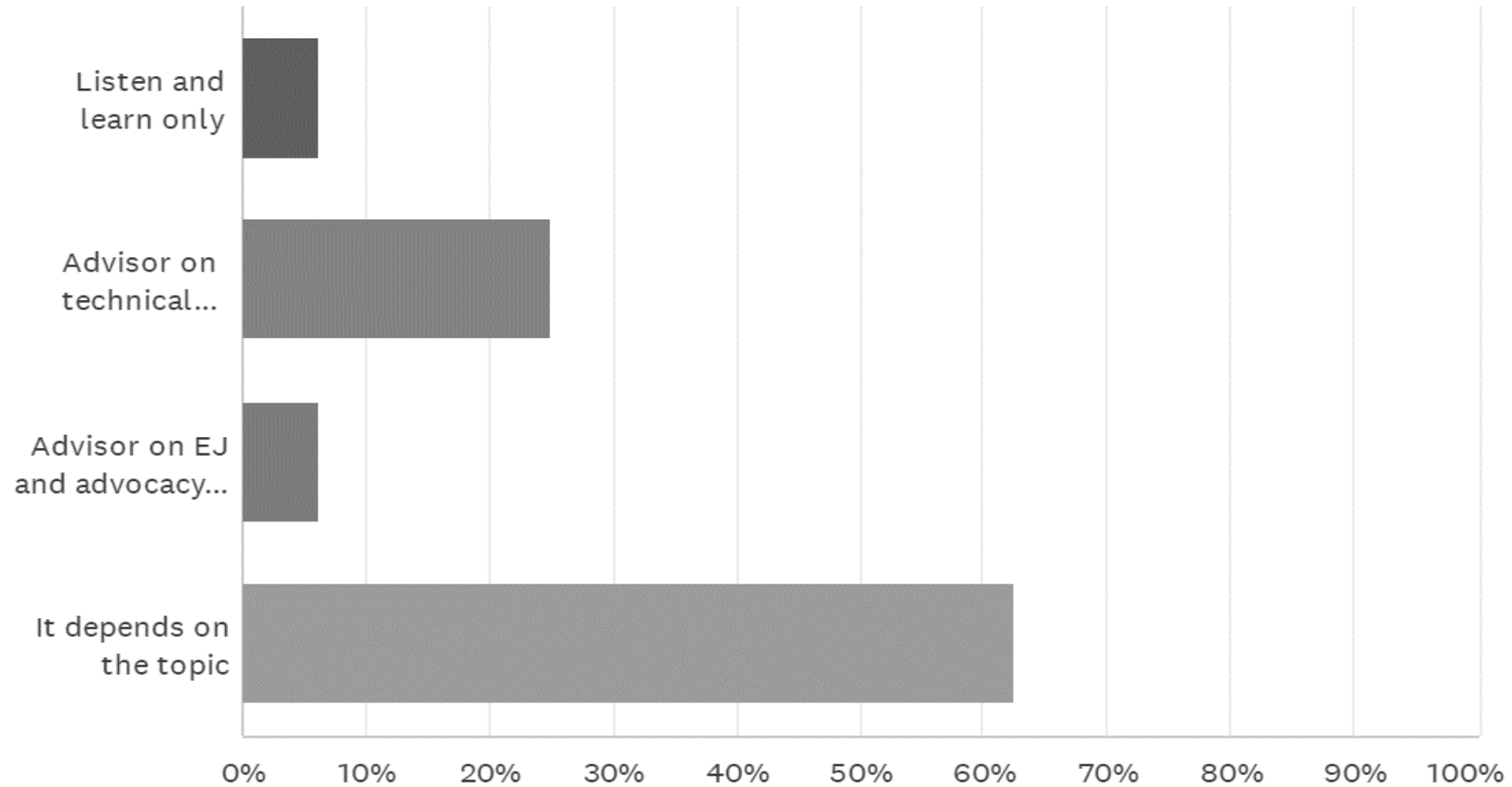
# Q1 When would you like to have our annual in-person meeting?

Answered: 15 Skipped: 1



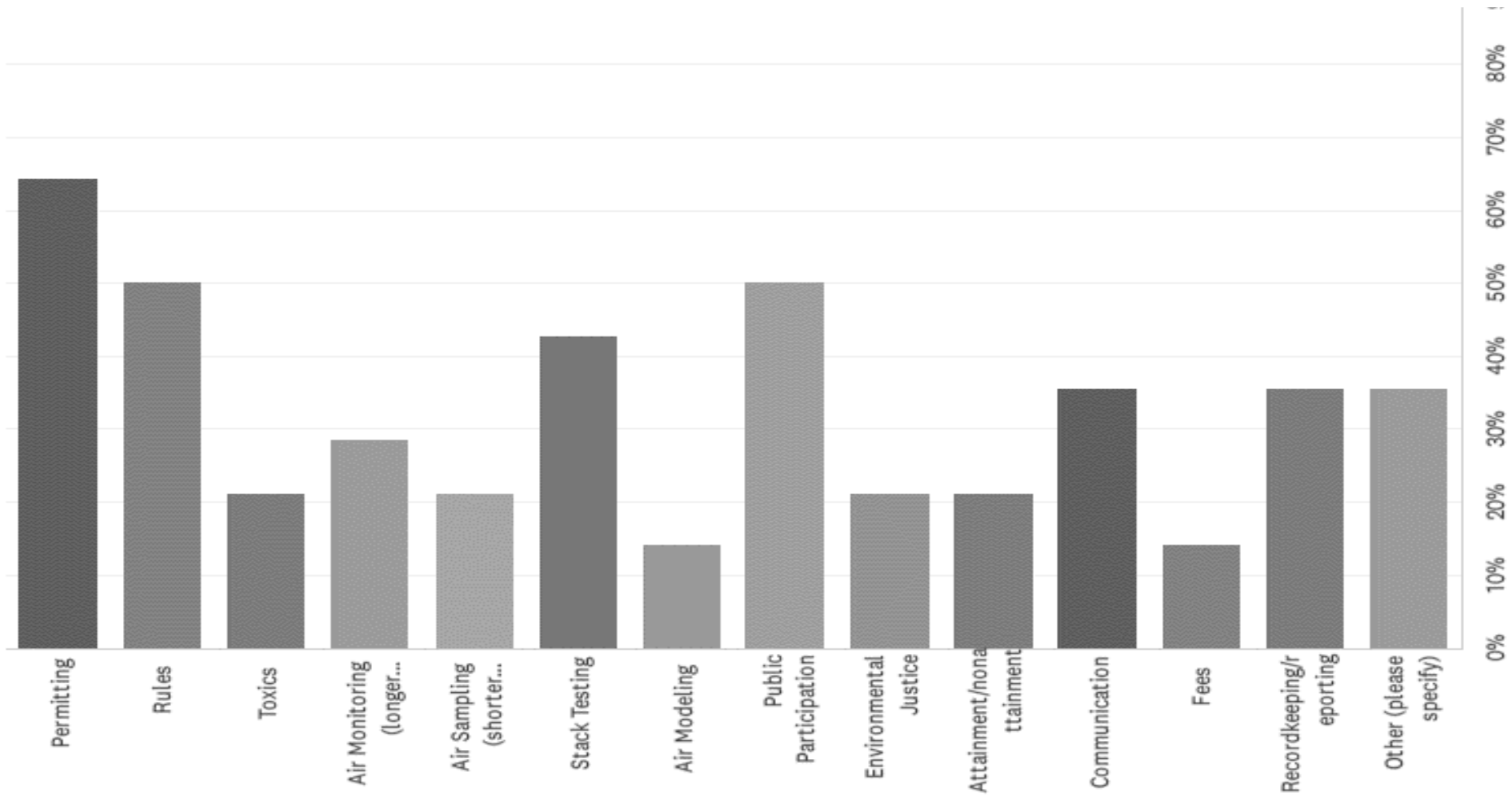
## Q2 What do feel your role is on the council?

Answered: 16 Skipped: 0



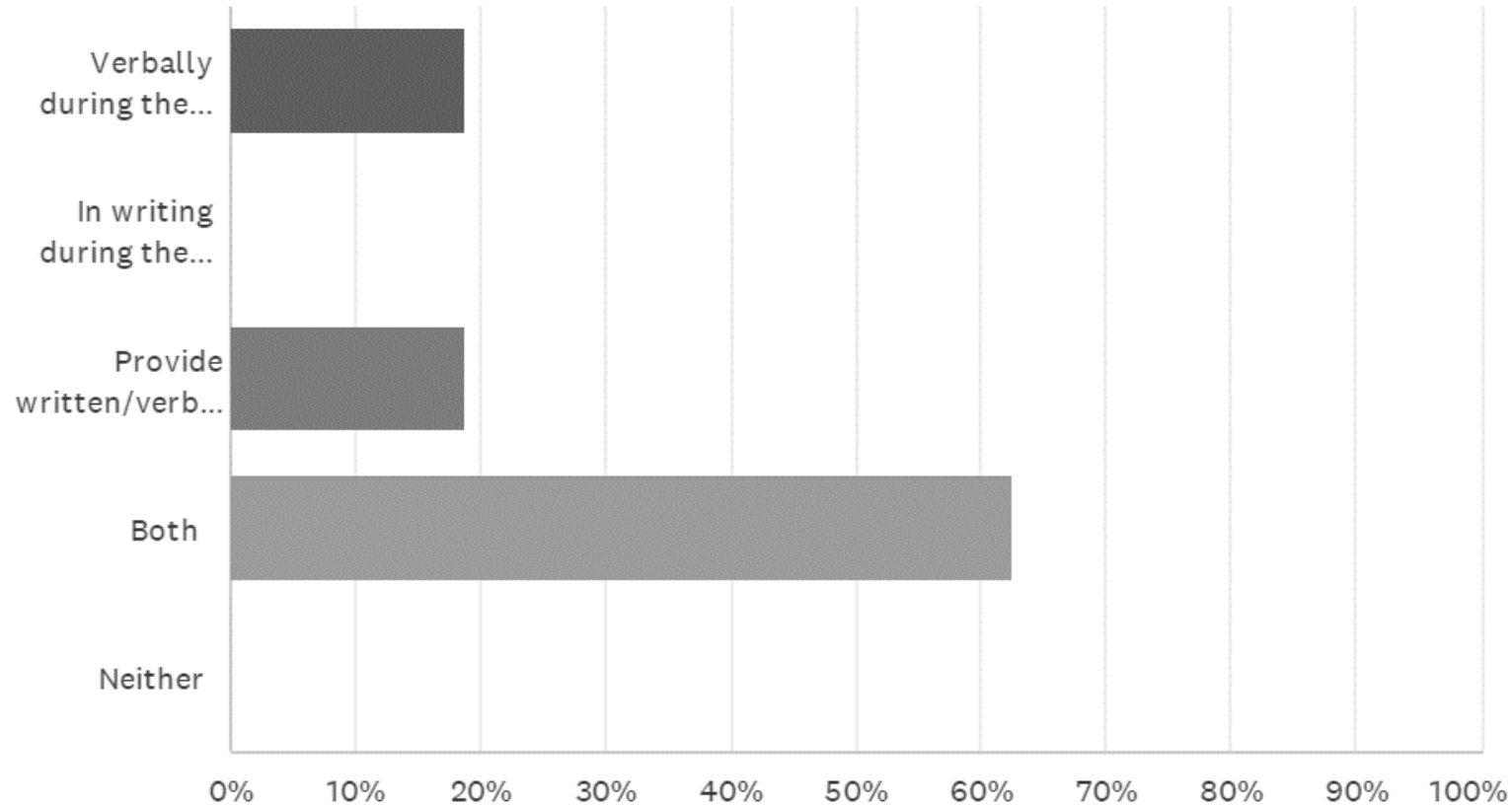
# Q3 What areas do you feel you can advise us on? (Choose all that apply)

Answered: 14 Skipped: 2



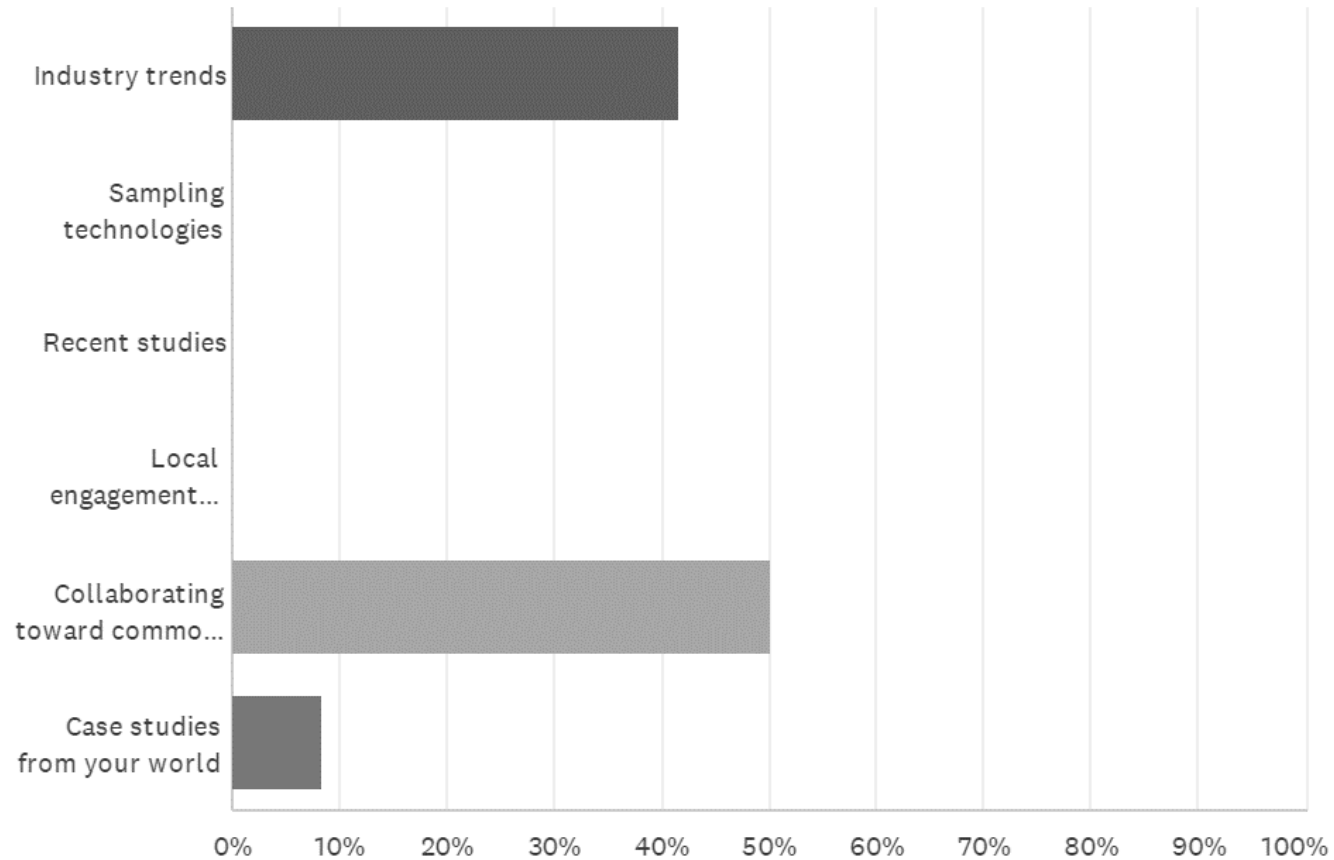
# Q4 How do you feel is the best way for you to ask questions/offer feedback?

## Q5 Your expertise can also be a benefit to us! What air quality topics can you share with the council?

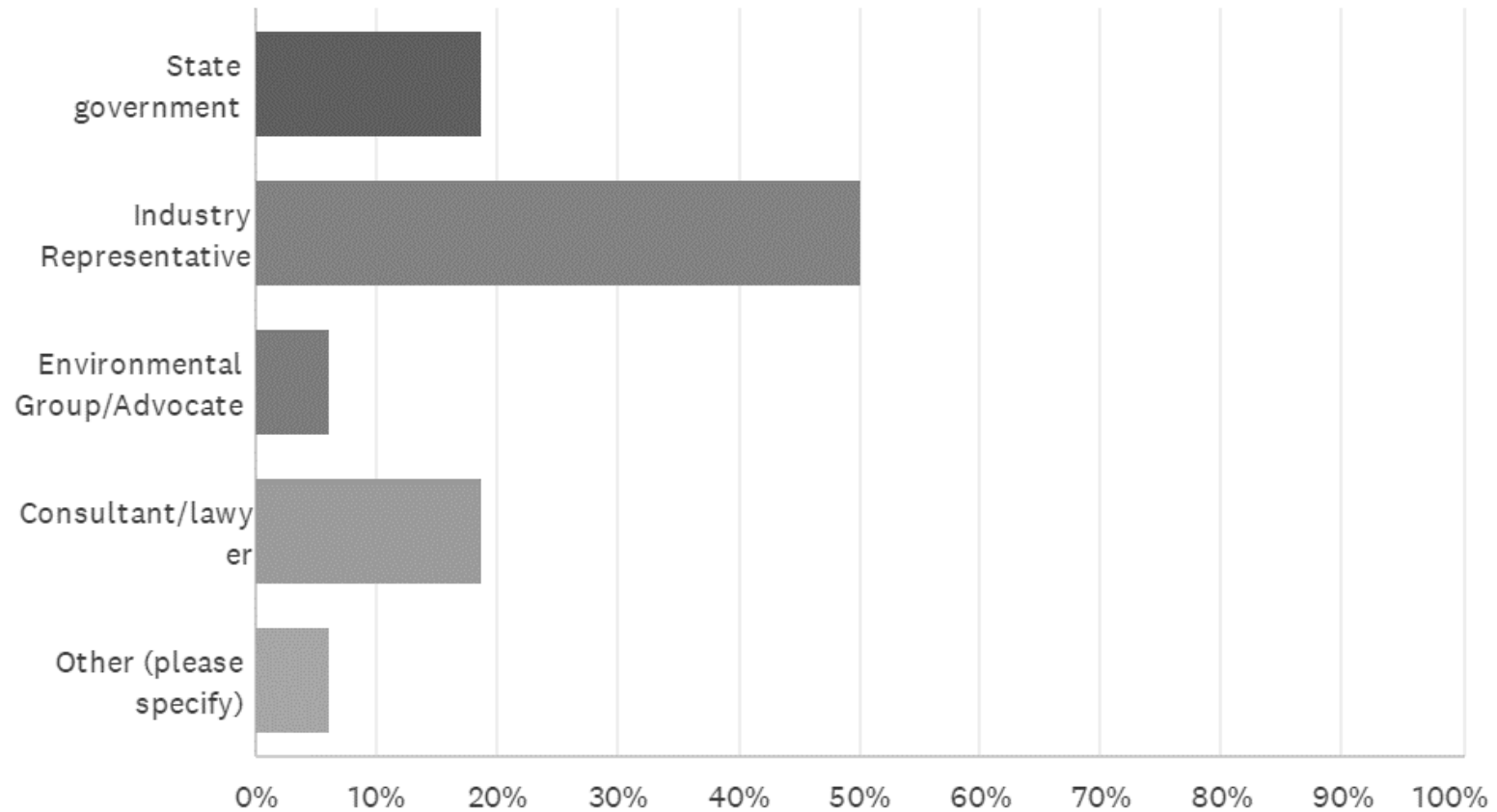
