

**Purpose:** Recommend strategies in each of 5 topical areas that have high potential to serve Michigan's GHG emission reduction goals in an equitable manner.

### **Objectives:**

- Develop a baseline understanding of current carbon emission levels, opportunities 1. and barriers to reducing emissions, and equity considerations.
- 2. Discuss decarbonization strategies, in consideration of the opportunities and barriers
- 3. Develop a bulleted list of recommendations for what needs to happen in the next 9 years—by 2030—to achieve Michigan's 2050 climate goal.
