7. SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION

The petitioner and their representatives have stated that there was historical use of the area for boat docking, lake access, and recreation. The area was not maintained and is marginally functional for boat docking and lake access. The petitioner's consultant stated that the emergent wetland condition should not be regulated by EGLE.

EGLE stated that they have approved over 98% of applications submitted to them. Further, EGLE has not decided on this project. EGLE stated that the proposed dredging activity at the site is regulated, which is self-evident by the submission of an application. EGLE's intent is to be protective of the lake bottom and shallow water habitat, but believes there is a permittable use for this site.

The Panel questions were focused on the historical use and the applicability of regulation for this site. After reviewing the submitted information and information presented at the meeting, a recommendation was submitted.

8. PANEL RECOMMENDATIONS TO RESOLVE PERMIT APPLICATION CONCERNS

The Panel recommends that EGLE and the Petitioner consider an alternative that minimizes dredging but considers the location of the dock, dimensions of two boats (a pontoon boat and fishing boat), and a small recreational area within the historically used area.

The Panel recommends to the EGLE Director that a compromise be reached that is protective of the environment, assures maintenance of historic use and is in compliance with applicable laws.
