**ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

By Petition dated June 26, 2023, the Petitioner requested approval from the Supervisor to increase production above the 200 barrels of oil per day (BOPD) and 200 thousand cubic feet of gas per day (MCFGPD) allowables established by Order No. 18-2007 to 400 BOPD and 400 MCFGPD for the Schug 31-4 HD1, with a daily flaring limit of 200 MCFGPD. The Schug 31-4 HD1 well was drilled on a 120-acre drilling unit approved under R 324.303.

The Administrative Law Judge determined that the Notice of Hearing was properly served and published. One answer to the Petition was timely filed by Carl and Amy Stender ("Respondents") with the Supervisor as to this Cause. The Supervisor designated this a joint meeting/joint hearing as to Cause No. 05-2023, 06-2023, 07-2023, and 08-2023 pursuant to R 324.1205(1)(b) and directed that testimony be presented in person at the hearing. Respondents did not attend the hearing in this matter.

Under testimony provided by Richard Moritz, Vice President of Land for the Petitioner during the hearing, the Petitioner withdrew its Petition as to this Cause to increase the oil and gas allowable for the Schug 31-4 HD1. The Petitioner did ask that any future request to increase the oil and gas allowable for the Schug 31-4 HD1, as requested in this Cause, be handled on the staff level without the necessity of re-filing the Petition. There was no objection thereto on the withdrawal of the petition.

**NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:**

1. Future requests that are specific to an increase of the oil and gas allowable for the Schug 31-4 HD1 must be filed as a new petition. 1996 AACS, R 324.611 and Order No. 18-2007.

2. This matter is dismissed without prejudice.
