Mr. Campbell,

Please accept the following responses to your review comments.

- -Items 1-4: Contact information is now listed at the end of the operating plan.
- -Item 5: A location map is attached to show the location of the receiving station and treatment lagoons.
- -Item 6: Categories of septage waste are listed in the definition of domestic septage.
- -Item 7: We have revised the plan to limit portable toilet waste to 1000 gallons per day. Right now we receive very little waste of this type. It is dumped and diluted immediately when combined with flow from the Max Prison. By the time the waste reaches the lagoon system it is well diluted. This has not been a problem in the years we have accepted this waste.
- Item 8: The system design flows are 500,000 gpd ultimate average and 2.018 mgd ultimate maximum (peak hour). The design BOD is 200 mg/l. There are no loading and flow limits in the discharge permit. Only discharge quality limits.
- -item 9: The word "sludge" has been replaced by the word "waste" to clarify the intent.
- -Item 10: The septage waste contribution to our treatment system is currently very small and not threatening to our capacities. We will assess the system and operating plan and the service area as other waste haulers request disposal agreements.
- -Item 11: Letters and email correspondence is enclosed. We have no comments from general public.

- -Item 12: A copy of the newspaper public notice is enclosed.
- -Item 13: The receiving station is a Manhole in the collection system and is noted in the location map.
- -item 14: Due to the location of the receiving station the septage is extremely diluted before it enters the lagoon cells.
- -Item 15: Please accept this written description of a flow diagram. The septage is dumped at a manhole located near the Baraga Max Prison facility. The wastewater collection system conveys all the Village's wastewater to the main lift station located approximately 1 mile downstream. The sewage is pumped to the lagoon system located about 1.8 miles to the south.
- -item16 and 17: We have only one septage hauler and one portable toilet waste hauler in current operations. They have the responsibility of providing monthly disposal reports to our office. They are required to call the Village office before dumping. We intermittently inspect their processes.
- -Item 18: The Village has a website but it is relatively new and mostly inactive at this point. We don't have a website administrator.

Septage Receiving Facility Operating Plan

The Village of Baraga Wastewater Treatment Plant, located on Myers Rd is currently accepting Domestic Septage and will continue to receive domestic septage for treatment.

Domestic Septage received by the facility is only that defined as the septage pumped from home septic tanks, recreational vehicles, cesspools, portable toilets, type 111 marine sanitation devices, or similar storage or treatment works that receive only domestic sewage. Not other categories are accepted.

The Village of Baraga WWTP will not accept Food establishment septage grease trap waste or any waste, including domestic septage waste that is determined by the Village of Baraga DPW Director or designate to cause harm to the operation of the Wastewater Plant.

The Village of Baraga WWTP requires all septage haulers to be licensed by the State of Michigan. A copy of the current license and all updates will be sent to and kept on file at the Village Office.

Fees: \$80 per domestic septage waste load with a 1500 gallon per load maximum. The Portable toilet disposal fee is \$20 per load for a 350 gallon maximum. Haulers will be billed monthly based on Septage Volume Pump Record sheets. These sheets are kept by the hauler and given to the Village by the end of each month. Haulers are expected to pay by the due date. Those who do not pay will lose their dumping privileges.

All haulers need to have a signed Agreement prior to disposal of wastes to the Village of Baraga Wastewater Plant. The current restriction on the service area is a 15 mile radius around the active receiving site. On October 12, 2010, the radius will be 25 miles. All haulers will be considered on a individual contract basis with the Village. The Village reserves the right to stop dumping privileges with any hauler at any time due to capacity limitations or other dumping concerns.

The septage receiving facility capacity shall not exceed 6000 gallons per day of septic tank waste, 1000 gallons per day of portable toilet waste, or 325 # of BOD per day from all waste streams combined. Current summer average received is about 2000 gallons per day with a maximum of 4800 gallons. The Village's wastewater treatment facility capacities are 500,000 gpd ultimate average and 2.018 mgd ultimate maximum (peak hour). This limit is based on the capacity of the main lift station. The design BOD is s 200 mg/l.

The operating hours of the septage receiving station located at the intersection of Wadaga Rd and Westland Dr will be 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM, seven days a week. These hours will become effective upon MDNRE approval of the operating plan.




