SUPPLEMENTAL SEPTAGE DUMPING AND TREATMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS

REFERENCE AND AUTHORIZATION: ARTICLE IV, SECTION 413 OF THE INDUSTRIAL WASTE RULES AND REGULATIONS AS ADOPTED BY THE BENTON HARBOR - ST. JOSEPH WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT JOINT BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, (JOINT BOARD), ON NOVEMBER 9, 2000.

SUPPLEMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE DUMPING AND TREATMENT OF DOMESTIC SEPTIC TANK WASTES (SEPTAGE) AT THE BENTON HARBOR - ST. JOSEPH JOINT WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT (JOINT PLANT).

SECTION 413-1: RATES AND CHARGES, INVOICING DEPOSITS:

CHARGES FOR DUMPING AND TREATMENT OF SEPTAGE WASTE AT THE JOINT PLANT:

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2012 - \$50.00 PER 1,000 GALLONS

EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2015 - \$60.00 PER 1,000 GALLONS

THE JOINT BOARD RESERVES THE RIGHT TO PERIODICALLY ADJUST THE CHARGE FOR DUMPING AND TREATMENT OF SEPTAGE TO REFLECT:

- 1) CHANGES IN THE BULK TREATMENT FEE FOR THE TREATMENT OF IN-SERVICE (SEWERED) CUSTOMERS OF THE JOINT PLANT.
- 2) CHANGES IN TREATMENT AND/OR CAPITAL COSTS INCURRED BY THE JOINT PLANT.
- 3) OTHER FACTORS AS DEEMED APPROPRIATE BY THE JOINT BOARD.

CHARGES FOR VOLUMES OTHER THAN SPECIFIED ABOVE SHALL BE PRORATED PER 100 GALLONS.

INVOICES WILL BE ISSUED MONTHLY BASED ON THE NUMBER OF LOADS RECEIVED AND THE RATED CAPACITY OF THE DELIVERY TRUCK(S). NO ALLOWANCE WILL BE MADE FOR PARTIAL LOADS (LESS THAN THE RATED CAPACITY OF THE DELIVERY TRUCK). A DELIVERY SLIP IDENTIFYING THE SEPTIC TANK WASTE HAULER, DELIVERY TRUCK LICENSE NUMBER, RATED TRUCK CAPACITY AND THE SOURCE OF THE SEPTAGE WASTE SHALL BE PROVIDED WITH EACH DELIVERY. PAYMENT FOR DUMPING AND TREATMENT CHARGES IS DUE UPON RECEIPT OF AN INVOICE, BUT IN NO EVENT SHALL PAYMENT EXTEND BEYOND 30-DAYS FOLLOWING THE INVOICE DATE.

A DEPOSIT MAY BE COLLECTED AND HELD AS SECURITY AGAINST FUTURE BILLINGS AND CHARGES. THE DEPOSIT WILL BE RETURNED AFTER A SATISFACTORY PAYMENT RECORD HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED. FAILURE TO PAY INVOICED AMOUNTS WILL RESULT IN THE TERMINATION OF DUMPING AUTHORIZATION AND INITIATION OF NECESSARY ACTIONS TO COLLECT PAST DUE AMOUNTS.

SUPPLEMENTAL SEPTAGE DUMPING AND TREATMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS

October 16, 2014

SECTION 413-2: GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- A) ANY PERSON, FIRM OR COMPANY MAKING APPLICATION TO DUMP SEPTAGE AT THE JOINT PLANT SHALL:
 - PROCURE AND PROVIDE ALL REQUIRED STATE OF MICHIGAN AND/OR COUNTY LICENSES/PERMITS.
 - PROVIDE INFORMATION IDENTIFYING THE NAME AND BUSINESS ADDRESS OF THE SEPTIC TANK WASTE HAULER AND THE LICENSE NUMBER, RATED CAPACITY AND MAKE AND MODEL YEAR OF THE DELIVERY TRUCKS.
 - PROVIDE SATISFACTORY EVIDENCE OF PROOF OF AUTOMOTIVE LIABILITY AND PROPERTY DAMAGE INSURANCE. (FAILURE TO MAINTAIN SATISFACTORY INSURANCE WILL RESULT IN TERMINATION OF DUMPING AUTHORIZATION).
- B) WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION SHALL BE OBTAINED FROM THE JOINT BOARD TO DUMP SEPTAGE WASTE AT THE JOINT PLANT. DUMPING AUTHORIZATION SHALL BE SUBJECT TO ANNUAL RENEWAL AND MAY BE RESCINDED AT ANY TIME FOR FAILURE TO FULLY COMPLY WITH PROVISIONS OF THESE SUPPLEMENTAL SEPTAGE DUMPING AND TREATMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS AND/OR THE JOINT BOARD INDUSTRIAL WASTE RULES AND REGULATIONS.
- C) A STATEMENT SHALL BE FILED ANNUALLY CERTIFYING THAT SEPTAGE DUMPED AT THE JOINT PLANT COMPLIES WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THESE SUPPLEMENTAL SEPTAGE DUMPING AND TREATMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS AND THE PROVISIONS OF THE AFOREMENTIONED INDUSTRIAL WASTE RULES AND REGULATIONS.
- D) SEPTAGE WASTE SHALL BE STRICTLY INTERPRETED TO MEAN WASTE RESULTING FROM SANITARY AND/OR DOMESTIC SOURCES. THE DUMPING OF ANY WATER OR WASTE ORIGINATING FROM AN INDUSTRIAL OR COMMERCIAL PROCESS OR THE SLUDGE, PRECIPITATE OR CONGEALED SUBSTANCES RESULTING FROM ANY PERSON'S WATER, WASTE OR AIR POLLUTANTS AS DEFINED BY THE JOINT BOARD'S INDUSTRIAL WASTE RULES AND REGULATIONS IS PROHIBITED.
- E) THE JOINT BOARD RESERVES THE RIGHT TO SEEK CIVIL AND/OR CRIMINAL ACTION AGAINST ANY SEPTIC TANK WASTE HAULER FOR THE DUMPING OF WATER OR WASTE MATERIAL NOT IN CONFORMANCE WITH THESE SUPPLEMENTAL SEPTAGE DUMPING AND TREATMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS AND/OR THE INDUSTRIAL WASTE RULES AND REGULATIONS AND TO SEEK MONETARY RECOVERY FOR ANY ADDITIONAL COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE HANDLING, TREATMENT AND/OR DISPOSAL OF SUCH WASTE MATERIAL(S).
- F) THE JOINT BOARD RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REFUSE SERVICE TO ANYONE DISCHARGING WATER OR WASTE WHICH MAY BE HARMFUL TO, IMPAIR, OR INTERFERE WITH THE OPERATION OF THE JOINT PLANT, ITS TREATMENT PROCESSES, EFFLUENT TREATED WATER QUALITY, OR RESIDUAL SOLIDS HANDLING METHODS.
- G) THE JOINT BOARD MAY PERIODICALLY SAMPLE AND ANALYZE SEPTAGE WASTE TO VERIFY THAT SUBSTANCES WHICH MAY EXCEED APPLICABLE PROVISIONS INDUSTRIAL WASTE RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND/OR "LOCAL LIMITS" AS ADOPTED BY THE JOINT BOARD, ARE NOT PRESENT IN THE SEPTAGE WASTE.
- H) THE JOINT BOARD RESERVES THE RIGHT TO ESTABLISH SPECIFIC HOURS DURING WHICH SEPTAGE MAY BE DUMPED AT THE JOINT PLANT.
- I) SEPTIC TANK WASTE HAULERS SHALL KEEP THE JOINT PLANT'S SEPTAGE RECEIVING TANK AREA CLEAN AND WASHED DOWN FOLLOWING EACH DUMP CYCLE.
