SUBJECT: Administrative Completeness Determination, Hazardous Waste
Management Facility Postclosure Operating License Renewal Application;
Ford River Raisin Warehouse; MID 005 057 005

Effective April 22, 2019, the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality, Waste Management and Radiological Protection Division, became the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE), Materials Management Division (MMD).

The MMD has reviewed the revisions to the Hazardous Waste Management Facility Postclosure Operating License Renewal Application (Application) for completeness. The Application was reviewed for compliance with Part 111, Hazardous Waste Management, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (NREPA); and the administrative rules promulgated pursuant to that part. A summary of submissions pertaining to the completeness of the Application is below.

- On June 16, 2017, the MMD received the Application, submitted by The Mannik & Smith Group, Inc. (MSG), on behalf of Ford Motor Company (Ford).
- On September 28, 2018, the MMD issued a Completeness Notice of Deficiency (CNOD), detailing the administratively incomplete aspects of the Application.
- On December 20, 2018, MSG submitted a response letter to the CNOD, which included revisions to the Application.
- On January 9, 2019, MSG submitted additional revisions to the Application, including a signed EQP 5111 form and an updated Postclosure Cost Estimate.
- On January 11, 2019, MSG submitted a Certification of Postclosure Care letter.

Based on our review, the MMD hereby determines that the Application is administratively complete. The MMD will proceed to conduct an in-depth evaluation of the Application to determine if the facility satisfies the technical requirements of Part 111 of the NREPA and its administrative rules; and the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, as amended.
