SUBJECT: Compliance Assistance Inspections by Local Health Departments

Your local health department may be contacting you to arrange for a compliance assistance inspection of your facility to evaluate compliance with Part 138, Medical Waste Regulatory Act, of the Public Health Code, 1978 PA 368, as amended (MWRA).

A pilot program is underway again this year as the Medical Waste Regulatory Program, Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE), Materials Management Division (MMD), partners with local health departments to perform compliance assistance inspections of medical waste producers. The goal of these inspections is to increase awareness of the requirements of the MWRA and assist medical waste producing facilities in complying with these requirements.

These inspections will include a very basic evaluation to determine the following:

- Whether the facility has a current registration and the facility type is correct.
- Whether the facility has a complete medical waste management plan on file.
- Whether the medical waste is properly stored prior to removal/disposal.
- Whether the facility has records documenting staff training and medical waste shipments.

An example of the inspection report form that will be used is enclosed. After the inspection, you will be provided a copy of the inspection report which will include any recommendations from the inspector. The inspector may follow-up with you either by phone or a second visit to ensure the noted issues have been addressed.

We hope this pilot program will demonstrate that we can be more responsive to your needs and administer a more effective Medical Waste Regulatory Program overall through this partnership with local health department staff.
