Documentation for an amendment to the Bay County Solid Waste Management Plan (Plan Amendment) was received by the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) on April 8, 2002.

Based on the information submitted and after further discussions with management staff of the Waste Management Division (WMD), the DEQ has determined that the Plan Amendment was not prepared in accordance with Part 115, Solid Waste Management, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended, and the Part 115 Administrative Rules. Specifically, the 67 percent local municipality approval was received prior to the public comment period and public hearing. It is the DEQ's determination that the Plan Amendment must receive at least 67 percent local municipality approval after the public comment period and public hearing have been completed. By this letter, the DEQ is providing the County with the opportunity to withdraw the proposed Plan Amendment. If the County does not choose to withdraw the Plan Amendment before August 5, 2002, the WMD staff will recommend the Director disapprove the Plan Amendment as submitted.

During your June 21, 2002 conversation with Ms. Lynn Dumroese, DEQ, WMD, you asked for specific statutory references to support the DEQ's decision. The DEQ has made this determination based on the following requirements of Part 115. Section 11533(2) of Part 115 states an amendment to a Plan shall be prepared and approved as provided in section 11533, 11534, 11535, 11536, 11537, and 11537a. Section 11534 discusses the requirement for appointing a Planning Committee to prepare a County Solid Waste Management Plan (Plan) and states the members of the Planning Committee shall be appointed every two years. The documentation provided for the Plan Amendment indicates the members of the Planning Committee were contacted for their input and none objected to the proposed Plan Amendment; therefore, the County proceeded with the Plan Amendment. Section 11535 then describes the requirement of the proposed Plan to be made available for a period of not less than three months to the DEQ, to each municipality within the affected county, and to adjacent counties and municipalities that may be affected by the Plan or that have requested the opportunity to review the Plan. Section 11535 further states the comments received during the comment period shall then be submitted to the County Board of Commissioners (BOC) and a public hearing shall be conducted before formal adoption. Following the sequential order of events, Section 11536(2) describes the next step in the approval process, which states the BOC shall formally act on the plan following the public hearing. Section 11536(4) then requires the Plan to be approved by the governing bodies of not less than 67 percent of the municipalities.

The Part 115 Administrative Rules further support the DEQ's determination. Rule 709(4) reaffirms an Amendment of the Plan shall follow the same procedures for review and adoption as the original Plan and the updates. Rule 707 discusses the first steps of the approval


process, which include having the proposed Plan made available for a review period of not less than three months and the requirement to have a public hearing conducted before formal adoption by the County, the municipalities, or the state. Rule 707 then states after the public hearing, the Designated Planning Agency shall make any revisions to the Plan, in response to the public comment period and shall submit the Plan to the Planning Committee. As previously mentioned, the County took responsibility for preparing the Plan Amendment and therefore, took responsibility for making any revisions to the Plan Amendment in response to the public comment period. Rule 707 also clarifies that formal action by the BOC must come after the public comment period. It appears the BOC did not make any changes to the Plan Amendment and took formal action to approve the Plan Amendment on March 12, 2002. Rule 708 describes the last step in the approval process, which includes the requirement of the Plan to be approved by no less than 67 percent of the municipalities in the County before being submitted to the Director for approval.

The DEQ has consistently applied this approval process for previous amendments to County Solid Waste Management Plans. Further, the DEQ believes Part 115 and the Part 115 Administrative Rules clearly indicate that the 67 percent local municipality approval must occur after formal action by the BOC and the BOC cannot formally act on the Plan Amendment until the public comment period and public hearing have been completed.

As previously mentioned, the DEQ has determined that the Plan Amendment was not prepared in accordance with Part 115 and the Part 115 Administrative Rules. The County must now have the local municipalities act on the Plan Amendment and receive at least 67 percent municipality approval. As previously mentioned, if the County does not withdraw the Plan Amendment before August 5, 2002, the WMD staff will recommend the Director disapprove the Plan Amendment as submitted.

She stated this amendment had already been distributed to the local units for their consideration. It was passed with over two-thirds voting in favor of the amendment. She stated the purpose of this meeting today was to hear public comments. She asked if anyone wished to speak and stated the comments will be transcribed and responded to if requested

Don Wagner, Plant Manager at the General Motors Powertrain, Bay City Plant:

“As you described, the General Motors Powertrain Bay City Plant requested a review and modification of the Bay County Solid Waste Management Plan to allow importation and exportation of industrial waste with Shiawassee County. This modification will enhance the Bay City Plant’s manufacturing competitiveness. General Motors implemented an internal waste disposal program to improve their handling of the solid waste while also reducing costs. The internal program consists of limiting the number of industrial waste landfills the corporation uses nationally and incorporating every U.S. GM facility into this program, including our Plant here in Bay City. The landfill in Shiawassee County is the closest licensed industrial waste plant landfill of the six that are included in General Motors’ national internal waste disposal program. The Bay City Powertrain Plant is currently incurring considerable transportation costs by shipping industrial waste to the next closest industrial landfill included in the General Motors program, which is in Northwood, Ohio, 158 miles away. This issue is unique to the Powertrain Bay City Plant because other Michigan counties in which GM facilities are located already have an importation/exportation agreement with Shiawassee County. Modifying the Bay County Solid Waste Management Plan will enable the Bay City Powertrain Plant to continue to operate with competitive costs so that it can maintain its role as a valuable member of the community.”

As there were no other public comments made, the Public Hearing adjourned at approximately 7:30 p.m.
