Staff of the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Water Bureau conducted a facility inspection at the Pall Life Sciences (Pall) facility in Ann Arbor, Michigan on March 25, 2008. The inspection was conducted to assess your facility's compliance with National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit No. MI0048453. I would like to thank you and your staff for your assistance during the inspection.

The inspection consisted of a tour of the treatment process, laboratory, and outfall to Honey Creek. The treatment system appeared to be operating normally at the time of inspection, and the facility is well operated and maintained. The laboratory and offices have recently been (or are in the process of being) moved to Building 5 due to the expected closure of the main building. Sampling is conducted as required in the permit and the facility consistently meets its effluent limitations. Records are well-kept and discharge monitoring reports are submitted as required.

You are reminded that Part I.A.7. of your NPDES permit regulates storm water discharges associated with industrial activity at this facility. Pall has previously developed a storm water pollution prevention plan (plan). I did not review the plan as part of this inspection. As a general comment, you are reminded that as per Part I.A.7.d. of your NPDES permit you are required to review the plan on or before June 1 of each year and maintain written summaries of the reviews. The plan should be amended as needed to ensure continued compliance with the terms and conditions of Part I.A.7. of the permit. In addition, you must ensure continued implementation of the plan to help ensure that storm water discharges from your facility will not cause a violation of water quality standards.


