## The Sault Ste. Marie Area Watershed Project

October 1, 2004 to September 30, 2006

The city of Sault Ste. Marie is the primary urban concentration along the banks of the St. Marys River, an area of concern defined by the International Joint Commission in 1987 due to several beneficial use impairments plaguing the great river. This project sought to determine the severity of nonpoint pollution sources originating from the urban center and prescribe actions to eliminate them. Several local agencies, including Lake Superior State University, the Chippewa/Ottawa Resource Authority, and the City of Sault Ste. Marie, worked together to develop the Sault Ste. Marie Area Watershed Management Plan, from which the team will work toward eliminating city-wide sources of pollution affecting the St. Marys River.

- Conservation easements

The Sault Ste. Marie Area Watershed Project (SSMAWP) will stabilize priority erosion sites, eliminating tons of sediment from reaching area streams and the St. Mary's River.



SSMAWP will work with landowners and land trust organizations to promote permanent protection of priority properties containing critical habitats, wetlands, and remaining green space.



SSMAWP's information and education campaign will increase the local community's awareness of remaining natural features of the Sault Ste. Marie area and implement strategies to protect water quality in the watershed.



SSMAWP will attempt to restore the natural integrity of area streams through in-stream habitat improvement, wetland and riparian zone protection and storm water management.
