Four Township Water Resources Outreach Project

January 1, 2003 to June 30, 2005

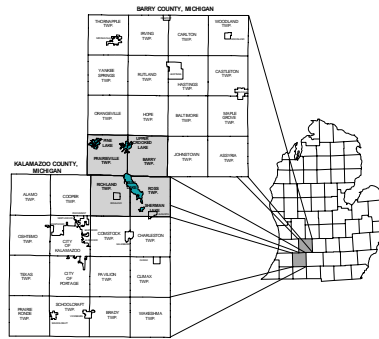
The Four Township Water Resources Outreach project area includes Prairieville and Barry townships in Barry County, and Richland and Ross townships in Kalamazoo County. This project included the implementation of land use policies that will help minimize the impact of future development on the land and water resources of the four townships. Many of these policies have been incorporated into township and county zoning documents and thus will continue after grant funding has ended. The environmental benefits afforded by this project will include preservation of natural features, reduced pollutant runoff (primarily nutrients and sediments) to area lakes and streams, and maintenance of the area's natural hydrology.

Match Funds: \$ 70,000

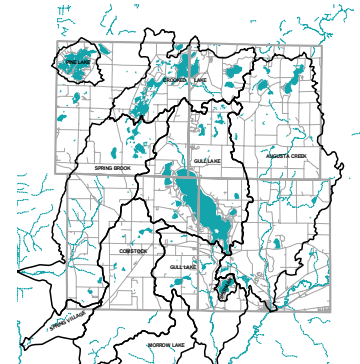
