Portage Creek Watershed Plan Implementation

October 1, 2012 - March 31, 2015

Portage Creek is the Huron River watershed's highest quality creek. With few problems associated with urban runoff, protection of its ecosystem and pollution prevention is the priority. This project's goals included creating an awareness of water quality and watershed issues to promote positive actions to protect and enhance the integrity of the Portage Creek watershed, and adopting riparian buffer protections and stormwater management policies in three townships in the watershed. Project accomplishments include the production of "Waterfront Wisdom" a 12-page educational booklet sent to lake and stream riparian residents in the watershed, and the passage of buffer protection language in the zoning ordinances of Lyndon, Dexter, and Unadilla Townships.

Grant Amount: \$ 148,200 Match Funds: \$ 60,900

Total Amount: \$ 209,100

Best Management Practices:

- •Green Infrastructure planning maps and documents in Lyndon, Unadilla, Dexter, and Stockbridge Townships and Stockbridge Village.
- •Setback and buffer requirements for residential development in Lyndon and Dexter townships.
- •Overlay protection zone in Unadilla Township.
- •Open Space Development requirements to protect waterways in Dexter Township.









I&E Activities:

- •An updated and reformatted 12-page tips booklet, "Waterfront Wisdom," sent to lake and stream riparian homeowners, promoting riparian buffers and natural shorelines among other best practices.
- •A supporting Waterfront Wisdom advertising campaign, run in a regional newspaper.
- ·A post project survey measuring change in environmental attitudes and awareness.
