Overview

The Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy's (EGLE) annual budget bill provides receive and expend authority for the Environmental Response Fund and the Natural Resource Damages Fund to support department actions that are authorized by a court of competent jurisdiction and set forth in a final court order or judgment in an action to which the department is a party.
