Starting at the Beach Pavilion

Where water meets the land is one of the most dynamic and dramatic landscapes Mother Nature has to offer. Come with us for an interactive educational experience to see, smell, feel and discover the mysteries of the Lake Michigan shoreline. Walk along the shoreline and travel back into deep time. Find artifacts of the warm shallow sea that once inhabited this land and explore the multitude of organisms that call the shoreline home.

Dune Wanderers

Wednesdays: July 8, July 22 and August 5, from 9 a.m. - 11 a.m.

Starting at the Beach Pavilion

Join us in a hands-on discovery of how life takes hold where almost nothing should survive. Become a Dune Wanderer and explore the shores and dunes of Petoskey State Park. It is an ecosystem constantly evolving with the passage of time. We will explore the many microclimates found within the park and discover how the living and nonliving factors in each microclimate work together to create the stunning dune system of Petoskey State Park.
