MICHIGAN BOARD OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS MEETING

MOTION PREVAILED

Chair Report

Fedele congratulated Hookham and Sanders on being elected Chairperson and Vice Chairperson. She stated that the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES) 2020 Annual meeting was held virtually, but she was unable to attend. Wysack stated that a recording of the meeting was available to watch through the NCEES website.

Department Update

Wysack reminded the Board Members to check their state email address regularly as it is now the source of communication with the Department. She stated that the state email address will soon be used as the User ID for Egress, so it is important to get in the habit of checking the email on a regular basis.

MacIntosh stated that the rules came back from the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR) with 2 issues about continuing education. The Department reviewed the requests and made the needed changes. The rules have now gone back to JCAR for the next step in the promulgation process. He stated that he hoped they can be approved by the end of the year.

MacIntosh stated that the Bureau will hold the next new Board Member Training on February 18, 2021. All Board members are welcome to attend. He stated that the training has been split into two parts, Health and Occupational boards.

PUBLIC COMMENT

James McLaughlin with Kettering University asked the board to enhance the continuing education rules to include non-traditional engineers. He stated that there is an increased cost of completing continuing education. He also encouraged the continued use of in-person and online courses as it applies to continuing education.

Christoph Lor with the American Society of Plumbing Engineers stated that he was looking for Michigan to endorse a plumbing exam option as part of the mechanical engineering exam. This is not legislative, as he is not asking for the creation of a new discipline.

Jay Hall and Kenneth Alfano, biomedical engineers, supported McLaughlin that non-traditional engineers existed.

Molham Al Hossami stated that he earned his engineering degree outside of the United States and has been found to be deficient in biology. He wanted to know if the Board could waive the requirement. Wysack referred him to the Licensing Division.
