Executive Summary:

The *Direct Appropriation Report* for 2026 contains reporting requirements which are mandated pursuant to Section 227(8) of Public Act 22 of 2025, Article 10.

Section 227(8) of Public Act 22 of 2025, Article 10 requires the following:

(8) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (9), beginning March 15 of the current fiscal year, the department shall post a report in a publicly accessible location on its website. The report must list the grant recipient, project purpose, and location of the project for each grant described in subsection (1), the status of money allocated and disbursed under the grant agreement, and the legislative sponsor, if applicable. The department shall update the report and post the updated report in a publicly accessible location on its website not later than June 15 of the current fiscal year and again not later than September 15 of the current fiscal year. The department shall include in the report the most comprehensive information the department has available at the time of posting for grants awarded.

This grant program is for clean energy improvement and on-site wastewater system replacement or repair. Michigan Saves shall grant funds to individuals or small businesses within the state who have a history of having difficulty obtaining traditional capital or households with a combined income not exceeding 300% of the federal poverty level and where businesses indicate a state of financial need or vulnerability. The amount granted to a single individual or business cannot exceed \$100,000.00.

This grant agreement is to be executed by June 1, 2026, and will be completed by September 30, 2030, pursuant to section 227(6) in PA 22 of 2025, article 10. Michigan Saves is implementing the grant work.

Grant funds may be used to support a loan loss reserve fund or other comparable financial instrument to further leverage private investment in clean energy improvements.

This grant agreement is to be executed by June 1, 2026, and will be completed by September 30, 2030, pursuant to section 227(6) in PA 22 of 2025, article 10. Michigan Saves is implementing the grant work.

These funds shall be used to support activities by the Michigan Task Force 1 in response to emergencies and other situations that require technical rescue expertise and equipment.

This grant agreement was executed on February 23, 2026, and will be completed by September 30, 2030, pursuant to section 227(6) in PA 22 of 2025, article 10. As of March 15, 2026, \$500,000 of the total award has been released to the grantee. Michigan Mutual Aid Box Alarm System is implementing the grant work.
