

## Boiler Certificate FAQs

Q: When is my boiler inspection due?

A: The boiler inspection is due by the EXP DATE which is printed is on your Certificate of Boiler Inspection on the right.

Q: Who inspects my boiler?

A: In Michigan boiler inspections are done by either Deputy Boiler Inspectors employed by the state or by Special Inspectors, employed by boiler insurance companies.

Q: How do I contact my inspector?

A: If your boiler is insured, contact the boiler insurance company or your insurance agent.

If you aren't sure about insurance coverage, contact the State of Michigan Boiler Division.

Q: What information will I need to provide?

A: The boiler STATE NO. which is located on the Certificate of Inspection on the right.

The address where the boiler is located.

A contact name and phone number for scheduling the inspection.

Q: Do I need to do anything to prepare for the boiler inspection?

A: State Boiler Rules require periodic maintenance on most boilers, see the CSD-1 FAQ.

Many boilers can be inspected while in service, some boilers must be inspected internally.

You can discuss inspection preparations with your inspector.

Q: How long is my Certificate of Inspection good for?

Boilers providing hot water (hydronic) heat or domestic hot water supply are good for three years.

Boilers providing steam heat are good for two years.

High pressure (over 15 p.s.i.) steam boilers and some non-heating low pressure steam boilers are good for one year.
