Failure to comply with the continuing education requirements of the order will result in a minimum one-day suspension until compliant. If Respondent is unable to obtain two years of satisfactory employment, Respondent may submit to a pre-approved skills assessment no sooner than 90 days prior to the end of the maximum period of probation. Failure to comply with the employer reporting or skills assessment requirements will result in a minimum one-day suspension until compliant. If the license remains suspended for more than six months, reinstatement is not automatic. Failure to comply with any condition of the order constitutes a violation of the order.
