Dorsey College: Dorsey Schools has been renamed to Dorsey College. Additionally, Salena Neal, RN, MSN, has been named the Executive Director of Nursing for the college.

Dorsey College – Saginaw: John-Paul Stohon, MSN, RN is the director of nursing.

Jackson College: The program submitted its pre-accreditation candidacy application with NLN-CNEA.

Northwestern Michigan College: Tamella Livengood, RN, MSN is the director of nursing.

Application for Initial Approval:

Hondros College of Nursing: The 5-year budget and financial statement were missing. The program was asked to supply the missing information before the next steps of approval take place. Additionally, the program was asked to provide a copy of the survey that was sent and the list of programs within a 50-mile radius from its proposed campus that received it. Please ensure that the survey meets criteria of R 338.10303a(2).

Serenity Health Training Institute: The site visit report was submitted by Esther Bay was approved. The program indicated that it would admit 25 students per cohort. However, there were only clinical placements for 24 students. Therefore, initial approval for the program was granted for up to 24 students per cohort.

Quality Care Training: The survey that was conducted was not sufficient. All schools within a 50-mile radius need to be included and the survey and the survey must obtain information about the impact of this new program on existing programs. Please see R 338.10303a(2) for specific content. The information about how pediatric clinicals would be handled was approved.

Lastly, the program is encouraged to carefully evaluate the End of Program Student Learning Outcomes to determine any impact on student achievement.

West Shore Community College: The program would like to teach NUR 254 in an online format which is a change in the delivery method of instruction. The Major Program Change was approved.

Western Michigan University: The program is requesting permission to provide more than 50% simulation in pediatrics for the Fall 2021 and Spring 2022. The Major Program Change was approved. However, per R 338.10306(d) simulation laboratory hours shall not exceed 50% of each clinical experience. Lastly, the program is encouraged to carefully evaluate the End of Program Student Learning Outcomes to determine any impact on student achievement.

Minor Program Change:

Jackson College: The program will change NRS 215 – Pathophysiology to two 7-week courses to allow for the content to be evenly distributed and align with Jackson College's 7-week course initiative. The Minor Program Change was approved.

NCLEX Improvement Plan:

Baker College-Auburn Hills: The NCLEX Improvement Plan was approved. It is suggested that the program look at the admission and progression criteria and analyze student achievement of learning outcomes to determine if there are particular content areas that need to be addressed in the curriculum.

Faculty Exception Request:

Gogebic Community College – Houghton: A Faculty Exception Request was submitted for Trevor Ploe for LPN Level concepts – Fundamentals of Nursing and Medical Surgical Nursing. The starting date for the request is September 15, 2021. The request was received on August 24, 2021. The faculty exception request was denied as the submission was missing the following: Evidence of enrollment, education plan signed by the advisor, and official transcripts from the graduate program.

Further Mr. Ploe cannot serve as the director of nursing until his MSN has been obtained. R 338.10305a(3) requires the program director to hold a minimum of a graduate degree with a major in nursing. The rules do not provide for exceptions to this requirement. Please resubmit after the criteria is established.

West Shore Community College: A Faculty Exception Request was submitted for Kristie Richards for Medical Surgical Nursing Clinical, Mental Health, Nursing Pediatric Nursing, and Leadership in Nursing. The starting date for the request is August 26, 2021. The request was received on August 11, 2021. This is her 3rd exception. The Faculty Exception Request was approved.
