

Limited Alcohol Buyer License General Information

A Limited Alcohol Buyer license:

- License issued to a person located in Michigan which allows the purchase of alcohol, 190
 proof grain alcohol for medicinal, mechanical, chemical or scientific purposes.
- Generally issued to hospitals and pharmacies that use alcohol in preparing medicines and to laboratories, chemical companies and other businesses that utilize alcohol for scientific experiments, sterilization and mechanical purposes.
- May purchase alcohol from the Commission or a business licensed as a Seller of Alcohol by the Commission.
- \$10.00 annual license fee. License fee may not be prorated for part year licensure and is payable at the time of initial application.

How To Apply For A License:

Complete and submit the <u>Limited Alcohol Buyer License / Seller of Alcohol License Application</u> (LCC-157). A checklist of required items is on the first page of the application form.

General Information:

Release of Alcohol:

All shipments of alcohol and bulk alcoholic liquor must receive prior approval from the Commission in the form of an approved <u>Release of Alcohol or Alcoholic Beverages for Commercial Use (LCC-350)</u>.

Sales/Purchase Records:

All licensees are required to keep all records pertaining to sales and purchases of alcoholic liquor for a minimum of 4 years.
