ORDER DENYING MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION

On September 11, 2018, Administrative Law Judge Julia C. Stern issued her Decision and Recommended Order¹ in the above matter finding that Respondent did not violate Section 10 of the Public Employment Relations Act, 1965 PA 379, as amended, and recommending that the Commission dismiss the charge and complaint.

The Decision and Recommended Order of the Administrative Law Judge was served on the interested parties in accord with Section 16 of the Act.

On November 28, 2018, we issued a Decision and Order dismissing the charge on the grounds that no exceptions had been filed to the Decision and Recommended Order of the Administrative Law Judge by either of the parties for a period of at least 20 days. On December 10, 2018, Charging Party sent an email to the Commission expressing her disagreement with its decision. Because Charging Party seeks relief from the Commission, we will treat Charging Party's email as a motion for reconsideration of our earlier decision.

We have carefully reviewed the motion and find that the arguments presented therein are without merit and/or fail to raise issues cognizable by this Commission. Accordingly, the motion is hereby denied.
