- ▶ In operation since 1969, the BSBP Training Center (BSBPTC) is the only comprehensive rehabilitation training center in Michigan specializing in assisting youth and adults who are blind or low vision.
- ▶ BSBPTC is open all year and can accommodate up to 29 participants in 27 private rooms and two training apartments.
- ► A length of stay can vary from a few weeks to several months, depending upon individual needs and goals.
- ▶ BSBPTC works to provide specialized/ customized training and employment services to assist participants and businesses in addressing challenges that may pose barriers to achieving their goals and objectives.
- ▶ Work-based learning experiences and vocational training are provided when appropriate.
- ► A participant's skill level will be assessed, and instruction will be provided in adaptive low vision and non-visual techniques from professionally trained staff in various skill areas.
