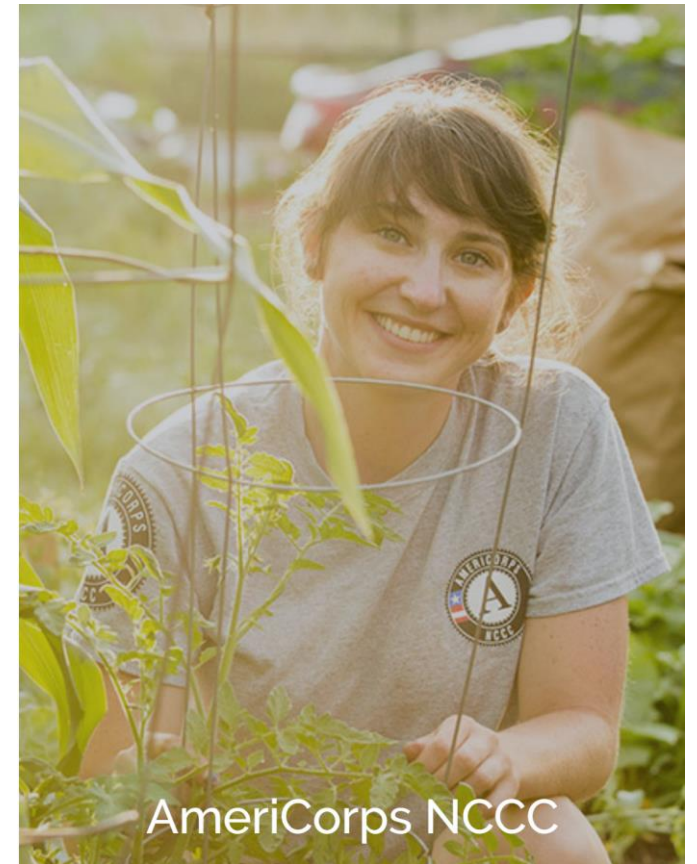

## AmeriCorps State and National Eligibility requirements:

- 17 years or older  
(no upper age limit)
- Pass a national service criminal history check
- US citizen, US National, Lawful Permanent Resident
- Service terms vary in length from 3 months to 1 year
- Full time and part time options

# National Civilian Community Corps

## FEMA Corps

- Residential, team-based program for young adults age 18-24 (Team Leaders 18+)
- 12 month service term
- Serve through Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)
- Must be a U.S. Citizen
- Disaster preparedness, response and recovery
- Teams provide disaster service including:
  - help survivors complete applications for disaster assistance
  - support disaster services facilities
  - respond to helpline calls
  - disseminate disaster preparedness and mitigation information to the public







## AmeriCorps NCCC Eligibility Requirements:

- 18-24 years old (18+ for Team Leaders)
- Traditional Corps: 10 month term, Team Leaders 11 month term
- FEMA Corps: 12 month term
- Pass a national service criminal history check
- Pass a medical eligibility assessment
- Traditional Corps: US citizen, US National, Lawful Permanent Resident
- FEMA Corps: US citizen

# AmeriCorps Alumni Survey



51% of respondents said AmeriCorps opened up a career path from them that they might not have otherwise considered.



42% of AmeriCorps alumni who were employed within six months after their service said that their employment resulted from a connection made during their AmeriCorps service.

## Step 1: Determine how you want to serve



### 1. Choose length

AmeriCorps members typically serve for 10-12 months, with options for shorter terms or summer positions.



### 2. Choose location

Apply for service opportunities in your own community or pick from a list of locations across the country.

Enter some personal information, your availability, level of education, and skill areas.
