2 MIOSHA Training Institute

MIOSHA Consultation Education and Training (CET) Division and Macomb Community College (MCC) have developed the MIOSHA Training Institute (MTI) through a formal alliance. The certificate program offers participants an opportunity to be recognized for their educational efforts and increased technical expertise.
