2 MIOSHA Training Institute

MIOSHA Consultation Education and Training (CET) Division and Macomb Community College (MCC) have developed the MIOSHA Training Institute (MTI) through a formal alliance. The MTI introduced an Assessment-Based Certificate program, effective October 1, 2007. The certificate program offers participants an opportunity to be recognized for their educational efforts and increased technical expertise. Courses are offered throughout the state in sponsorship with other M-TECSM facilities, community colleges, and safety and health organizations. 3 What You'll Learn . . .

This challenging course provides the information needed to safeguard your employees and property from electrical hazards in the work environment. We will discuss the application of MIOSHA electrical standards for general industry. Topics include a fundamental explanation of electricity, clarification of qualified vs. unqualified employees, how to work with electricity safely, as well as electrical installation expectations. Emphasis is placed on electrical hazard recognition, the safe and correct use of electrical testing equipment and case study review.

Due to the fast pace of the course, it is expected that the students have read General Industry Standards Part 39, Design Safety Standards for Electrical Systems, and Part 40, Safety Related Work Practices prior to attending class.
