2 MIOSHA Training Institute

The MTI introduced an Assessment-Based Certificate program, effective October 1, 2007. The certificate program offers participants an opportunity to be recognized for their educational efforts and increased technical expertise. Courses are offered throughout the state in sponsorship with other M-TECSM facilities, community colleges, and safety and health organizations. This half-day workshop thoroughly discusses the requirements of MIOSHA Part 7, Guards for Power Transmission. Topics include: complete review and interpretations of the standards; employer and employee responsibilities; terms and definitions; guards and devices used in industry; power transmission; disconnects and lockouts; and specific guarding requirements. Interactive discussion and exercises have been designed to enforce the concepts presented. **Virtual classroom with an in-person instructor.
