



**AGREEMENT ESTABLISHING AN ALLIANCE  
BETWEEN  
THE MICHIGAN OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH ADMINISTRATION  
AND  
CONSTRUCTION ASSOCIATION OF MICHIGAN (CAM)**

The Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MIOSHA) and the Construction Association of Michigan (CAM) recognize the value of establishing a collaborative relationship to foster safer and more healthful Michigan workplaces. To that end, MIOSHA and CAM hereby form an alliance to provide CAM's members and others with information, guidance, and access to training resources that will help them protect the health and safety of workers, particularly by reducing and preventing exposure to construction safety & health hazards and addressing awareness, training, compliance, and communication and collaboration, issues, and understand the rights of workers and the responsibilities of employers under the Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Act (MIOSH Act). In developing this alliance, MIOSHA and CAM recognize that MIOSHA's CET Division is an integral part of this effort.

Raising Awareness : Outreach and Communication

The participants intend to work together to achieve the following goals related to raising awareness:

**CAM**

- Promote safety and health training initiatives to CAM members.
- Promote member participation in MIOSHA CET offerings.
- Alliance to be promoted in CAM Magazine, Construction Buyers Guide, Social Media Construction Project News, CAM eNews Newbriefs and [www.BuildwithCAM.com](http://www.BuildwithCAM.com) [www.cam-online.com](http://www.cam-online.com)
- Publish articles about specific MIOSHA programs/initiatives.
- Provide MIOSHA with a PSA in the annual CAM Buyers Guide and a booth at the annual Trade Show.
- Welcome a MIOSHA CET representative at any CAM Safety or Council meeting.

- CAM Safety Achievement Award will recognize outstanding safety and health performance.
- CAM will promote the MIOSHA Training Institute and MIOSHA cooperative programs to members via email blasts, sharing of email lists, sharing of mailing lists, etc.; possibly sponsoring one or more MTI classes for chapter members.

## **MIOSHA**

- To share information on OSHA's National Emphasis Programs, State Emphasis Programs, Outreach, and opportunities to participate in initiatives and the rulemaking process.
- To share information on occupational safety and health laws and standards, including the rights and responsibilities of workers and employers.
- To convene or participate in forums, roundtable discussions, or stakeholder meetings on emphasis programs to help forge innovative solutions in the workplace or to provide input on safety and health issues.
- To encourage worker participation in workplace safety and health by participation and presentation the annual CAM coordinated trade show (Michigan Construction & Design Trade Show).
- To develop information on the recognition and prevention of workplace hazards, and to develop ways of communicating such information (e.g., print and electronic media, electronic assistance tools, and MIOSHA's and the CAM website, to employers and workers in the industry.
- To share information among MIOSHA personnel and industry safety and health professionals regarding CAM services, progressive practices, and effective approaches through training programs, workshops, seminars, and lectures.
- Help CAM's education manager with securing qualified instructors for CAM members.
- Promote alliance in MIOSHA Newsletter and on the MIOSHA website.
- Recognize CAM members that participate in MIOSHA programs via MIOSHA Newsletter and website.

## Training and Education

The participants intend to work together to achieve the following training and education goals:

### **CAM**

- CAM's education manager to work with MIOSHA representative to develop and produce new safety and health courses.
- Coordinate member participation in MIOSHA CET offerings.
- Promote and facilitate the cosponsor role for the MTI program.

### **MIOSHA**


- To develop effective training and education programs for construction safety & health concerns, and to communicate such information to constituent employers and workers in presentations and consultations.
- To develop effective training and education programs for alliance members to promote understanding of workers' rights, including the use of the MIOSHA complaint process, and the responsibilities of employers and to communicate such information to workers and employers.
- To deliver or arrange for the delivery of MTI construction and industry related courses annually.

MIOSHA's alliances provide parties an opportunity to participate in a voluntary cooperative relationship with MIOSHA for purposes such as raising awareness of MIOSHA's rulemaking and enforcement initiatives, training and education, and outreach and communication. These alliances have proved to be valuable tools for both MIOSHA and its alliance participants. By entering an alliance with a party, MIOSHA is not endorsing or promoting, nor does it intend to endorse or promote, any of that party's products or services.

An implementation team made up of representatives of each organization will meet to develop a plan of action, determine working procedures, and identify the roles and responsibilities of the participants. In addition, they will meet at least three times per year to track and share information on activities and results in achieving the goals of the alliance. MIOSHA team members will include representatives of the MIOSHA CET division.

The alliance agreement will remain in effect for three years from the date of signing. Any signatory may terminate it for any reason at any time, provided they give 30 days' written notice. This agreement may be modified at any time with the written concurrence of all signatories.




