SUBJECT: Pyrotechnics Manufacture, Storage, Sale, Handling, Use, and Display

- I. Purpose. To establish agency enforcement procedures to ensure compliance with the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) instruction for investigating the manufacture, storage, sale, handling, use, and display of pyrotechnics.
- II. Scope. This instruction applies to the General Industry Safety and Health Division (GISHD), the Construction Safety and Health Division (CSHD), and the Consultation Education and Training (CET) Division.

- X. Action. In 2011, the federal OSHA issued an instruction describing enforcement procedures for investigating the manufacture, storage, sale, handling, use, and display of pyrotechnics. With this instruction, MIOSHA adopts the federal OSHA Instruction CPL 02-01-053, Compliance Policy for Manufacture, Storage, Sale, Handling, Use, and Display of Pyrotechnics.

The federal OSHA instruction gives the steps that should be taken when considering whether to initiate an inspection and provides the general enforcement policies and procedures to apply when conducting inspections related to pyrotechnics.

All MIOSHA inspections and investigations for pyrotechnics shall be conducted in compliance with the FOM, as amended. Position titles referenced in the federal instruction should be addressed with comparable levels of management within MIOSHA.
