**Unemployment Insurance Agency Fraud and Noncompliance Report**  
**Quarterly Report**  
**3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter: April 1 – June 30, 2025**

Sec. 803. The Unemployment Insurance Agency shall provide a quarterly report within 45 days after the end of each quarter that includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- (a) The number of new fraudulent and noncompliant cases that have been identified or issued by the Unemployment Insurance Agency, classified by employer or claimant, during the quarter.

**Employers:** 0 fraudulent cases; 10,492 negligence penalty cases; 8141 non-reporting penalty cases; 13,718 wage penalty cases; 13,307 late reporting penalty cases

**Claimants:** 55 fraudulent cases

- (b) The total amount of penalties and interest issued on fraudulent and non-compliant cases during the quarter.

**Employers:** \$ 10,724,916.76

**Claimants:** \$ 3,754,147.27

- (c) The total amount of penalties and interest dollars received during the quarter by employer or claimant:

**Employers:** \$ 7,469,851.95

**Claimants:** \$ 1,016,438.93

- (d) The total amount of penalties and interest still owed to the state by employer or claimant:

**Employers:** \$ 6,495,763

**Claimants:** \$ 3,530,000

- (e) The number of fraudulent cases that have been appealed by an employer or claimant during the quarter.
