Reemployment Services and Eligibility Assessment Program





The Reemployment Services and Eligibility Assessment (RESEA) program provides customized services to proactively assist claimants deemed most likely to exhaust their Unemployment Insurance (UI) benefits.

How does the RESEA program work?

The Unemployment Insurance Agency (UIA), in partnership with the Michigan Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity, Workforce Development (LEO-WD), provides Michigan Works! Agencies (MWAs) funding to provide customized reemployment services to UI claimants.

Selected UI claimants will receive a letter informing them that they are required to participate in the RESEA program. The claimant must contact an MWA and schedule their appointment. During this appointment, the claimant is provided with several helpful resources, including:

- · An orientation to the MWA services
- Confirmation of an active Pure Michigan Talent Connect profile
- · Assessment of UI eligibility
- · A Discussion of Monthly Work Search
- · Development of an Individual Employment Plan
- · Review of specific Labor Market Information
- Referral to Reemployment Services

Who is eligible to participate?

Only claimants referred by the UIA may receive services through this program.



How is this program administered and funded?

LEO-WD distributes this funding to the 16 MWAs for administration of the RESEA program. Funding is distributed on an annual basis, at a minimum.

LEO-WD provides oversight and guidance for the operation of the program.
