MRS RATE RESTRUCTURING

- In 2019, MRS conducted a rate analysis and develop reimbursement rates for certain VR services, for compliance with federal regulations.
- The resulting report was issued in 2020, and phased implementation of the new rates began this month.
- A survey of our members documents these challenges and includes the following:
 - -75% of respondents report their organization has been negatively impacted by the new reimbursement rates
 - -A majority of respondents indicate new rates do not cover costs / provide sustainable margin in all 5 service categories
 - -There has been a 20% overall drop in referrals from 2019-22
