Who We Are

Michigan Alliance for Families is our state's federally funded Parent Training and Information Center. We are a Michigan Department of Education IDEA Grant Funded Initiative. The efforts of Michigan Alliance for Families align with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) to help improve results for children with disabilities.

Core Services

- Providing Information and Referral resources at the local and state level
- Mentoring to increase parent involvement in the Individualized Educational Plan (IEP) and leadership roles
- Collaborative learning, Leaders in Policy Advocacy (LIPA), and webinar trainings to increase parent knowledge and skill acquisition

Data Collection

- Quality and relevance of core services are measured through training surveys, service needs assessments, follow-up surveys, and individual interviews
- Data reflects a statistically significant increase in parent knowledge/participation and IEP satisfaction between initial and follow-up assessments

Recent Events
