## Emergency Powers Given to Governor

LANSING, Mich., May 26.--Gov. Kelly had legal authority today to proclaim a state of emergency in any specified area of Michigan in the event of a riot or natural dis-ir aster.

He signed a measure, enacted by the Legislature with an immediate effect clause, to permit "such reasonable orders, rules and regulations" as are deemed necessary for the protection of life and property Traffic can be controlled, use of buildings regulated, a curfew established, carrying of firearms prohibited and sale of liquor halted.
