Remediation: Instructors shall provide formal remedial training to a student who fails the first assessment. Instructors shall then offer the student a reassessment for that stage of fire. *The students need to be re-assessed only on the stages of fire that were performed unsatisfactorily.*

Any student who is being remediated shall be given a reasonable amount of remediation in terms of the time allotted for individual attention and the number of practice attempts offered. "Reasonableness" shall be determined by the primary instructor based upon the individual skill of the student, the amount of progress being made, scheduling and time constraints, consultations with the academy director, and when the instructor and student believe they are ready for the second assessment. Students are required to pass all skill area performance standards to graduate the academy, including firearms.
