This matter having come before the court on the ex parte motion of Plaintiff,
Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD), for an

Temporary Restraining Order to require Defendant Café Rosetta, LLC to cease operating a food service establishment without a valid license in violation of MCL 289.4101(1);

This Court having reviewed the verified complaint and motion;

This Court finds that Plaintiff has demonstrated the necessity for immediate action to prevent the continued violation of the Michigan Food Law, MCL 289.1101 et seq., and that continued operations of Café Rosetta creates an imminent threat to the public health;

This Court further finds that absent this temporary restraining order, MDARD and the public will suffer irreparable harm;

NOW THEREFORE, Defendant Café Rosetta, LLC is hereby ordered to appear before this Court on <u>JANUARY 7, 2021</u>, 2020, at <u>9.00A.m.</u> a.m./p.m. to show cause why an immediate injunction against them should not be issued.
