

Common fertilizer tonnage reporting errors

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The Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) requires all manufacturers and distributors of agricultural and certain specialty (non-farm or non-agriculture, i.e., residential turf or residential gardens) fertilizers and soil conditioner products to file a Fertilizer Inspection & Water Quality Protection Fee Payment Report Form annually. The reporting period is from January 1 to January 31 for the year prior.

Regulatory authority:

- Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act 451 of 1994, Part 85
- Regulation No. 634: Commercial Fertilizers

Common errors:

- When reporting for the spring semester, ensure you input the current year, not the new year.
- The Reporting Period must be input as "1" for the calendar year. Common mistakes include entering a month or another number.
- Do not reverse the month and date when inputting the Submission Date.
- When imputing your firm information, do not confuse your fertilizer license number with your Tax-ID number or EIN. Your fertilizer license number is the four-digit number found on the Michigan Fertilizer License List.
- Review each section carefully and fill in all applicable sections. The Zero Report Explanation box and Signature Line are often overlooked at bottom of the form.
- Do not leave the **Product Names** blank. This information is required.
- Nitrogen-Phosphorus-Potassium(NPK) should be rounded to the tenths. Do not enter nonnumeric characters.
- When filling out the **Container Type**, do not enter multiple values in one cell.
- When filling out the **Fertilizer Type**, do not enter multiple values on one line.
- When filling out Micros, round numbers to the tenth.
