2023 Pesticide Application Business License Renewal
This Is the Only Notice You Will Receive Regarding Your License Expiration

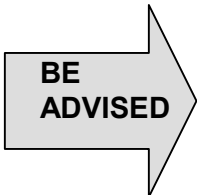

Enclosed is your 2023 Pesticide Application Business License (PABL) renewal packet. To ensure continuity of your license, you must submit the following with your renewal application prior to **December 31, 2022**.

- List corporation number and/or include a copy of corporation papers and/or assumed name documents.
- Include current copy of certificate of liability insurance.
- New license categories require a Notarized Statement of Experience form (PI-217) for the new qualifying applicator.

If the certification of the **firm's qualifying applicator** (applicator listed on renewal application with *) expires 12/31/2022, he/she **MUST RENEW their certification** before the business license can be issued. If you wish to change the firm's qualifying applicator or add a category, a Notarized Statement of Experience form must be submitted by the new qualifying applicator. The qualifying applicator can't be a qualifier at any other firm. **NOTE:** Please submit proper paperwork by November 2022 to allow for longer processing when changing qualifier or adding category.

If you are **DECLINING** to renew your 2023 license or if your firm is out of business, you must return the renewal application and mark the "Out of Business" box.



It may be a violation to continue to offer or advertise pesticide services after 12/31/22 without a license.
It is a violation for any applicator to commercially apply pesticides for your firm without current certification/registration credentials.
